

**ARENA CONDUCT CONTRACT
FOR ALL FAIRMONT YOUTH HOCKEY PLAYERS**

The Fairmont Youth Hockey Board of Directors has issued the following code of conduct for all players regarding their conduct and our program, Martin County Arena, surrounding grounds, and any away games or tournaments connected with Fairmont Youth Hockey.

GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT

The following conduct will **NOT** be tolerated!

1. Foul language
2. Fighting or abusiveness toward others (players, coaches, referees, or fans)
3. Floor hockey in arena building
4. Horseplay inside or outside the arena. (This includes throwing snowballs, tape balls, rocks, cans, etc.)
5. Lack of full equipment including face mask or mouth guard.
6. No player is to be on the ice during the ice resurfacing unless moving the nets.
7. No player is to go on the ice before a coach or supervisor is present.
8. No player is to go on the ice before the Zamboni doors are completely closed.
9. Vandalism or theft.
10. Intentional on ice tripping, stick swinging, or misuse of pucks.
11. Threatening other players, coaches, staff, or parents.
12. Lack of respect for fellow teammates, other teams, coaches, staff, etc.
13. Misuse or abuse of locker rooms or other players while in locker rooms.
14. Smoking, use of alcohol, or any mood altering drug.
15. During all open hockey sessions full equipment must be worn and there will be no checking, slap shots, hooking, tripping, and slashing.

CONSEQUENCES OF INFRACTIONS

If the above guidelines for **smoking, alcohol, vandalism, theft, and non-game fighting** are not met, the following steps will be followed.

1. First offense. Suspension, 4 weeks or 4 games, whichever is longer.
2. Second offense. Suspension, 6 weeks or 6 games, whichever is longer.
3. Third offense. Full suspension for season.

If the above guidelines for **other rules** are not met the following steps will be taken.

1. Warning - verbal. (You will have to sign sheet and acknowledge offense.)
2. Removed from next open skate if occurs at open skate. next practice if it occurs at practice, or next regularly scheduled game if it occurs at a game and a meeting with parents and grievance committee.
3. Removed from ice for one week. This includes any game, practice, open skate, or open hockey, plus another meeting with parents and grievance committee.
4. Player will be subject to suspension or other disciplinary action deemed appropriate by the grievance committee at a meeting attended by parents and player.

Parent or guardian must call the arena after receiving conduct violation notice before the player is permitted back on the ice.

I understand the above guidelines and agree to abide by them. I understand the steps that will be taken if a violation occurs.
