## Coaches Corner

### Keeping your mind in the game

One of the biggest challenges that I see our players facing is that they let themselves get distracted about things that they cannot control. Today's players take themselves out of a game before it begins due to negative thinking. Negative thinking results from a player worrying and focusing on things that are completely out of their control. A player cannot control what a coach thinks, or a referees' call or what an opposing team does. Allowing these negative thoughts to occur takes energy away from the player's body and limits their ability to focus on the game or situation at hand.

A player's ability to focus is the key to keeping their mind in the present and on the game. A player needs to focus on the positive thinking in relation to the game. An example would be for a player to recognize that they made a good pass to set up linemate for the last goal or recognizing when they are skating and working hard. A player should focus on being positive, and having reinforcing and supportive thoughts.

In the October USA Hockey Magazine there is an article titled "Playing Well May Be All In Your Mind." The article captures all the fine points of positive thinking and visualization. I believe it would be a great benefit for all players that want to excel and succeed at sports, and in life, should read this article. Visualization is used by all types of professional athletes from hockey to golf. While Tiger Woods has a tremendous amount of ability one of his greatest attributes is that he is one of the best at visualizing and focusing on the shot at hand and being in the present. The article gives "TIPS" on how to use visualization before, during and after a game.

It is important that when a player visualizes how they will play before a game that they do not see themselves making a mistake. Players should visualize themselves in the "perfect game." See themselves doing everything correctly and at a higher ability than they ever have before. They skate faster and harder. They have a harder and quicker shoot. They crash the net and work hard in the corners. They are doing all the little things perfectly. A player should never dwell on mistake or a "what if". This type of thinking just causes questions and doubts to creep into a player's mind and wastes both their time and energy.

Here is a little part of the article on Mental Preparation - "Mental preparation is just as important as the physical part when it comes to being ready to play". Please take the time to read this article as I think it will help in developing the visualization techniques and mental preparation that is needed for a player to develop and progress to the next level of the game.

Here are some other good books for understanding the mental and visualization aspects of the game.

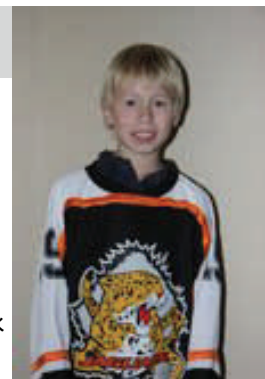
## Derek Martin

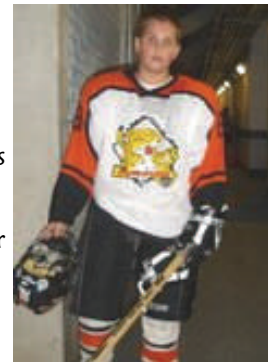
**How Long has your child been a Jaguar?** Played at Hyland since 2002

### Kasen Schamaun

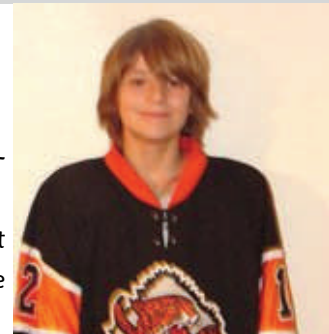
**How Long has your child been a Jaguar?** For the past 5 years

## Try-Out Survey Results

### 1. How helpful were the new Try-out procedures?

- 36% Felt it was Somewhat helpful
- 29% Felt it was helpful
- 22% felt it was very Helpful
- 13% not at all

### 2. Were Board of Directors available for questions and concerns during try outs?

- 38% Somewhat
- 34% Available
- 21% Very
- 7% Not at all

Note: See #3 below -- We will look at ways to increase the 55% (available + very) categories given our objectives for #3.

### 3. Were the Hockey Directors available for questions and conceres during try outs?

- 38% Not at all
- 32% Somewhat
- 26% Available
- 4% Readily available

Note: It was by design of the tryout process for Hockey Directors to not be available for questions/concerns of the members. So, the results of this survey indicate a success and not a failure. The Hockey Directors are moving from rink to rink, division to division, coach to coach and questions/concerns during tryouts are typically not productive and distract the Directors from the process.

### 4. Would you like to see more Scrimmages or Skill sessions or remain the same?

- 47% Would like to see more scrimmages
- 22% Would like to see more Skill sessions
- 31% likes the current process

Note: We may need more granularity on this with consideration of age/division levels. Midgets, for example, probably need less skills, whereas Squirts might benefit from more with variations in between. We went with more scrimmages this year in comparison to the past and again, perhaps we need to reconsider for younger divisions.

### 5. Were the Goalie Sessions useful?

- 34% Useful
- 24% Not at all useful
- 24% Very Useful
- 18% Somewhat useful

Note: Somewhat related to #4 and it should be stated that this serves as the skills portion for goaltender evaluations. Very difficult to get this in the other sessions and Coaches find these sessions very useful.

- 18% Some-what Efficient

**How long they've played:** Hunter began playing hockey at age 4. He has been with HHHA for the past 2 years in the 8U program.

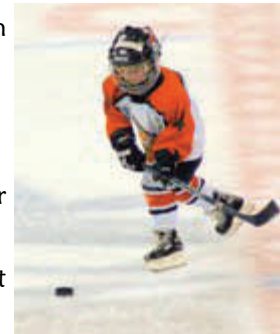
**Position, if relevant:** Hunter plays both a Forward and defenseman.

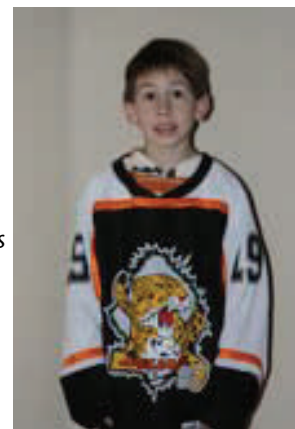
## Nathan Martin

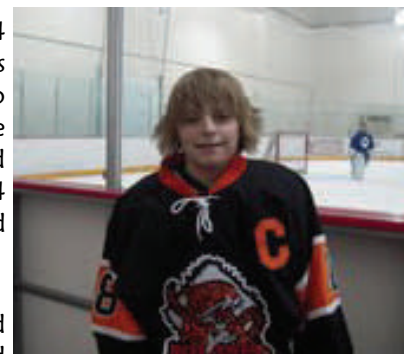
