Greetings, as I write this article, the snow is still on the ground and thoughts of spring are only evident in the very large piles of registration forms that we now have on the desk awaiting data entry into our database. We just concluded the major Spring Sport Bulk sign ups at Dick's sporting goods and it appears as though it was a successful venture. We tried a couple of days at Dick's last year and our volunteers and the people at Dick's all thought it went very well. I didn't get any complaints from parents and all appeared good. This year with the remodeling project at City hall, Dick's stepped up and offered to host all of the days and we think now that it was a very good idea.

I want to thank the volunteers that stepped up and volunteered to do our Information Technology work at WAA after the last newsletter. We discussed all of the people that came forth and have appointed Bill Lehner to fill that position.

The Bielenberg Sports complex is in the middle of a major discussion between the City of Woodbury and the South Washington County School District. The School District purchased the 80 acres next to Bielenberg to build the third high School on and when that happened the City took steps to insure that the total over all site was well planned and flowed well. In that process, the resulting site plan which includes, the original 80 acres of the Bielenberg site, the additional 80 acres to the South that the City purchased in 1998 and passed a referendum to improve, the 80 Swanson property site purchased by the school District and an additional 80 acre site to the

east of there that the City will take possession of sometime after 2008. The four sites combined will make a 320 acre area in the City that should afford a very pleasing sport/recreation area. The discussions as to exactly how this area will be laid out and what will be included in the site are on going and information should be available from both the City and the School District.

This plan greatly effects the current and future playing facilities that we have available to WAA for Baseball, Football, Soccer, and Softball and any other uses we put into the Bielenberg Dome. We believe that the Lighted Field spaces need to be increased for the ever growing numbers of teams that we put on the field each year. In 1994 when we teamed up with the City to get the passage of the first referendum for Bielenberg, WAA had 1,997 Families and 4,574 children playing in the 72 different programs that we offered then. Today, WAA consists of over 5,600 Families and 11,300 children participating in over 102 programs that we offer. If you look further in this newsletter (on page 4), there is a rendering of what the City thinks the overall site will look like in 2009 when it is complete.

The plan as detailed will change, but I think that it is important for all of our members to look it over and make comment if you have any. Overall, this will be beautiful site and complex, it should afford many opportunities for the children of Woodbury for years to come. If you look close, the plans that were laid out for the Bielenberg South addition in the 2004 referendum have been completely altered, the fields that were to be built there are now proposed to be built along Bailey road. When the City and School District got together to work out the site plan, the configuration seemed to be the best for fitting the school and as many Athletic fields as possible on the site. The Woodbury Ath-

letic Association is in constant contact with the City staff and we are having daily discussions as to what needs to go into the complex and where it should go. We are asking for as many lighted fields as we can possibly squeeze out of the budget and we will be the torch bearer for the membership in demanding great quality fields. There may come a time during this process when we may need your help. Stay tuned, we will let you know how things are going, mean while, if you have any questions or concerns about this project feel free to call and I will answer to the best of my ability or recommend someone for you to talk to.

As the spring sport season approaches it is important for each and every parent to remember what this is all about. Athletics give our children the opportunity to learn how to cope with the issues of daily life and that they are on the fields to have fun. There is no place in youth sports for yelling at the umpires, officials or coaches. There is a strong need for everyone to remember this and help police the other parents. WAA is firm in our commitment to provide a comfortable safe and enjoyable environment for the children of Woodbury to participate. We will not tolerate unsportsmanlike conduct at any of our events. **IF YOU FEEL YOU MUST YELL AT OFFICIALS, attend a professional sports program and get your monies worth. *The only yelling here, should be words of encouragement toward your team.***

WRESTLING

The 2006–2007 youth wrestling program is in its final weeks of competition.

In January, the wrestlers were active in the practice room, at individual tournaments across the metro area, and at a very competitive team tournament in Apple Valley where the team took 5th place.

In early February, the season was temporarily interrupted due to the shut down on the high school level and we lost a bit of our competitive momentum. The team was able to practice again starting on February 8th, and since that time the wrestlers have been in the room getting prepared for individual tournaments and state qualification tournaments. We currently have around twenty-five wrestlers who have qualified for youth state tournaments.

In March, we will be having our recognition banquet, closing down the folk style program, and starting up a Freestyle/Greco Roman wrestling program which allows interested wrestlers to continue to wrestle throughout the spring. As Doug stated in the last newsletter, he and I are working on transition activities and both wholeheartedly appreciate the support and effort from all of the wrestler parents and volunteers who have helped to make this program successful.

Baseball is just around the corner! I say this as it is still below zero temperatures outside but there is hope. Baseball sign ups for the upcoming season were held the last week and judging by the sign ups received we will have another great year. Kudos go out to all those parents who braved the dangerously cold weather to get to Dick's Sporting Goods and sign their child up for baseball!

Late registrations are still accepted at the WAA building. No late fee will be charged until March 1st. After that date a \$25 late fee will be added. This needs to be done because teams will already have started to be formed and uniforms ordered and the late registrations cause unexpected delays for our volunteers.

Our program will accept all registrations through March and guarantee that those kids will be placed on a team. After April 1st we will still accept late registrations and will fill all open spots on teams. I cannot guarantee they will be placed on a team however. If not placed on a team, a full refund will be made.

Our tentative season schedule is as follows:

For all those people that signed up to either head or assistant coach a team this year, we will have our annual coaches meeting in late March. Equipment and uniform hand out will take place April 13th and 14th. All coaches will receive a letter in the mail outlin-

ing these dates. As always, we are looking for more parents that want to help coach at all levels of play. It works out better if we can put three to four coaches on a team because of everybody's busy schedules.

Once again this year we will have a combined 5th and 6th grade league, combined 7th and 8th grade league, and the senior high league will be 9th – 12th grade. All other grades will be stand alone leagues.

If you or your child is interested in making some extra money this year, contact Barry Schalkle, our head of umpires for information on how you can get involved and umpire some games for the program. We are always looking for good people to umpire games. It can also be worked out that father/son umpire teams can work together. Our 2006 Football Season was one for the record books. WAA Youth Developmental Football had over 1000 participants this past season. 275 participated in Jr Royals Summer Football Camps, 211 - 1st and 2nd Grade Flag, 64 - 3rd and 4th Grade Flag, 246 - 3rd and 4th Grade Tackle, and 220 - 5th and 6th Grade Tackle.

The WAA golf program fosters a lifelong love and enjoyment of the game by providing opportunity to hone skill, learn and practice game etiquette, and develop good friendships.

The WAA Golf Program offers six summer leagues. Each league plays once a week for ten weeks during the summer. Leagues are comprised of four player teams, which are assigned a tee time for the season. The leagues are skill based with consideration given to the player's age. Each league has a supervisor who will organize and ranger the teams.

Participation awards are given at the end of the season along with trophies for individual and team play.
