The structure of the association is that the members elect the Directors from their respective organizations and the officers of the association. The officers, the Directors and the Membership Director all make up the "WAA BOARD". Each sport has a

sport specific board that makes the decisions and does the work of providing the specific sport. This system works very well, it has worked well for over 35 years. The strongest part of this system is you the members. Your suggestions and complaints help these fine volunteers make reasonable decisions about the programs that are offered to you the members. The sport Boards are constantly changing things that the membership thinks would make for a better program. Most decisions and all major changes are the result of months, maybe years of discussion. Nothing is done on a whim.

The WAA Board provides for continuity of rule and basic support for the sports that are part of WAA. The office located at 2630 Ojibway Drive is the hub of WAA activity. This office warehouse was built with funds that were loaned to WAA from The First National Bank

The Administration budget which includes the Mortgage, Executive Director, Receptionist and Bookkeeper's salaries, the Building utilities, Liability Insurance, Casualty insurance, Newsletter, Postage copy expense, and Printing is paid for with a combination of Membership fee's, Gambling receipts and Donations. Our Gambling receipts come from the Pull Tab booths at Bonfire's, Champ's, and Throwback's. The actual budget for individual sports is built from the user fees. The fee that you pay for your child to play a given sport is the actual cost of putting that program on the field minus the support funding that is given from the above sources.

When the organization sets dates for sign ups, equipment pick up, equipment hand out or for any other bulk function, please do your very best to attend one of the stated dates for the function. The staff at the WAA building has a great deal of business to conduct without taking late registrations, late equipment returns and such things. The

volunteers that set up those special dates put in countless hours preparing for those events. If THE MEMBERSHIP doesn't participate on the stated dates, it causes a Great deal of additional work for the volunteers and staff. Please try to be considerate and attend the bulk functions.

WAA is currently in the process of installing new computer equipment at the office which should help to make the entire WAA experience friendlier. We are working toward having On line registration for all sports thru a data server that would incorporate the current database and financial records. I will keep you up to date on the status of that system. We are currently every early in the process.

Coaching certification is here and real, we have been training coaches since March of 2006, we have now trained just over 400 coaches. We do require that you be certified if you want to coach in WAA so make sure and register for a class. Fall Rec Volleyball will be hosting it's own league this year for grades 3-6. Teams will practice one night per week and play a match on Saturday. We are very excited to offer this opportunity this year. Girls in grades 3-6 will use a Volley Lite ball and play on a 7 foot net consistent with the rules of USAV. Play will be modified to allow players to be more successful at learning and applying skills to game situations. 7/8th graders will two options this year for Fall Rec Volleyball. These teams will practice one night per week and play matches on Saturdays at Carver Elementary on Upper Afton Road in South Maplewood on Saturday mornings. The second option is a fall clinic.
