Spring is in the air, we are well underway in registration for spring sports, Baseball, Golf, Soccer, Softball, and Track registrations are nearing completion. By the time you read this newsletter, You should have already signed up. If you have not, go to WAA.WOODBURY.ORG, and click on register here and complete the process.

Beginning with this registration process, WAA implemented the new Web Trac registration process. This was a big undertaking for us but in the end should be a very helpful step for you the members, the volunteers that spend countless hours setting up programs and for the office personnel that try to hold it all together.

This system will hopefully end many downfalls of our previous systems. The past system allowed for registrations to get lost or misplaced, it allowed for a large number of Data entry errors that lead to information floating around in cyberspace somewhere and registrations not being complete because of it, and it also allowed for less than perfect accounting of the financials of the programs. The addition of this system will address all of these issues and add many new dimensions to the data base that will help us better manage the resources that we have available to us to serve you better.

On January 20th, 2008, we mailed **EVERY** household in our database, **5,365** of them, a yellow postcard with a Household ID number and information on how to use the new system.

The registration process for the spring sports began on February 2nd. Since that time we have received over 1800 requests for the household information to be resent. Please be patient and aware that we just don't have the staff to deal with that kind of pressure for information. I understand that there are reasons why postcards get lost, ignored, thrown away or just plain misplaced. Dealing with each request is not a big deal in it's self but, when you compile the all of them into that short of time frame, it is a big deal and becomes very hard to deal with.

I believe that we have met the demand, that most people are satisfied with the new program and we should have a smoother time with future registrations. Please take the time to put your household information and password in a safe place so that you are not needing to call or email here each time there is a registration. It is fun interacting with all of you on these issues but I would rather it be at a ball field or gym where the kid's are having a good time.

If you do have issues with the system, please let me know what they are so we can solve them. There have been a few issues that needed to be dealt with and hopefully we have handled them.

As we move forward in 2008, we are continuing to confront Coaches training, documentation, and recognition. We will be adding a link on our web page listing all of the coaches in WAA that have completed certification. We still require each and every coach of each and every sport session to be trained in the proper coaching attitude.

The WAA board of Directors is committed to providing a Safe and healthy environment for your children to achieve the level of activity that you and they have agreed upon. WAA will do everything we can to make sure that Coaches that we choose to coach your children have the highest of standards and are a good fit for the programs that

they coach in. If you have concerns about a coach, be sure to inform the Commissioner or Director of your sport of the concern. We will do everything possible to address your concerns.

Developmental Baseball

At on-site registrations at Dick's in February, a mom told her son that she was signing him up for baseball. He gave her one of those looks and said, "How are we going to play with all this snow?" Fear not, young lad, winter will soon be a distant memory and we will once again be in that heaven on earth called "baseball season!"

Woodbury Developmental Baseball League (WDBL) is a full-service program offering baseball opportunities for kids starting in Pre-K (born before 9/1/2003) through seniors in high school. The season will start in mid-April and will culminate in our annual season-ending tournament the weekend of July 11th – 13th.

PLEASE REGISTER YOUR KIDS FOR BASEBALL AS SOON AS POSSIBLE! This really helps us as we form teams, order equipment and uniforms, and generally prepare for the season. Late fees will be charged on all registrations starting in March. We will continue to accept all registrations through March and guarantee that those kids will be placed on a team. After April 1st, we will still accept late registrations if we have any open spots on teams – but there are no guaranteed placements at that point. Please note that our program is based on your child's current grade.

TRACK

It's not too late to sign up for Spring Track. The track season will get under way on Thursday, May 1st with the season ending the beginning to middle of July. Practices will be held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 to 7:00 at Tartan High School located in Oakdale. **Note the change of address from previous years!** Tartan High school is located at 828 Greenway Ave N. in Oakdale. This track is located just 4.7 miles from Woodbury High School. Take 494/694 (North) to 10th St. (exit 57), take a left onto 10th and then a left at Greenway. The school is immediately on the right. The best parking is behind the school, as it is located right next to the track entrance.

The practice format provides flexibility for athletes that participate in other sports (i.e. soccer, softball, baseball) or activities (dance, piano, gymnastics) that coincide with our season. The club asks that you attend all the practices that you are able to but does not require attendance at every practice. The

club attempts to keep our focus on sport in perspective, recognizing that family comes first.

Competition

WAA track will host four meets that will take place on a Tuesday or Thursday in place of practice. There will be one meet in May, two in June and one in July. Each family is permitted to choose the meets in which they want their athlete to participate. In addition to our hosted meets, there are a number of meets (6-10) available to us through the cities. Most of these meets have a small fee associated with them that must be paid by each participant at each meet.

Coaching

The program is based on introducing and refining track and field technique through positive feedback coaching process. This process emphasizes fundamentals, fitness, flexibility and form. Most important however, is the presentation of track and field as a fun, enjoyable and rewarding athletic activity that can become a lifelong healthy lifestyle.

WRESTLING

The youth wrestling program is in its final weeks of competition for the 2007 – 2008 season. Similar to last year, we had the boys grouped into an in-house program and a traveling program. The in-house wrestlers competed at the Stillwater tournament; thrilled the crowd at the HS wrestling recognition night with exhibition matches, attended several individual tournaments, and will round out the season with an in-house dual on March 5th. The goal of the in-house program is to introduce wrestling to the boys and to position them for a successful transition to the traveling program. We are pleased that several boys have expressed an interest to move to the traveling program next season.

The traveling program has built upon the momentum created last year and has had an amazing season. Prior to this season, the WAA wrestling program had never won a team tournament but has experienced lots of success on the individual level. The traveling program, lead by head coach David Albrecht, set a goal to win a team tournament. David instilled a focus on technique and conditioning and the traveling team has made a huge leap forward this season.

In December, the traveling team participated in the Dragon Duals in Litchfield. After losing a heart-breaker by 3 points to ACGC in the first round, Woodbury came back to beat Glencoe-Silverlake by 21 points and advanced to the consolation championship against Litchfield. In the match they lost by 4 points but the close matches had them fired up for the next opportunity.

That opportunity came on January 19th at the Lakeville Duals. The team defeated Cannon Falls, Forest Lake, and Chaska. They lost to Lakeville by 7 points and took home the 3rd place trophy. In the dual they defeated some high rated youth programs.

The traveling team hosted a very rewarding event

on Saturday, February 2nd. This event was conceived by a dad who was part of our program several years ago who moved to Iowa in concert with dads from our program. The event was tied to the Gopher/Iowa wrestling matches and each year the youth teams would travel to the location of the college matches and participate in their own border battle. This year a very talented group of youth wrestlers from Iowa faced the WAA traveling team and they took home “The Royal Piglet” traveling trophy. Next year the Woodbury team will travel to Iowa to reclaim the trophy.

The very next day, the traveling program participated in the Park Duals. The traveling team took home the 1st place trophy by beating teams from Holy Spirit, Park, and Tartan. This was the first team tournament won by the WAA wrestling program. A very proud moment for all involved. The traveling team will compete in 2 more team duals this season, one in Winona and the State Team championship. Also, most of the team members will compete in MN USA individual tournament in Rochester.

In March, we will be having our recognition banquet, closing down the folk style program, and starting up a Freestyle/Greco Roman wrestling program which allows interested wrestlers to continue to wrestle throughout the spring.
