Coordinated efforts between HSHA, School Principals and Athletic Directors, allowed HSHA the ability to send hockey coaches and association representatives to visit two local elementary schools in the hopes of increasing participation in the sport. These coaches and representatives had the opportunity to discuss questions related to hockey, demonstrated basic hockey drills and participated in floor hockey games with the children. The schools that were visited were very appreciative of the opportunity to experience hockey, with one little boy telling HSHA Squirt B Coach Robinson, "This was the best day of the school year that he has ever had!"

Hyland Hills Hockey Association also held a contest amongst the schools participating in wearing their jersey to school day. The individual school class with the most students wearing jerseys won a prize with the contest winner being Westminster Elementary School second grade class. Congratulation!!!

Additionally, Hyland Hills Hockey Association approached the Colorado Avalanche and encouraged their participation in HWAA. The Colorado Avalanche conducted a ticket promotion to its game versus the Montreal Canadiens - offering a free ticket to the first 1,000 youth hockey players wearing their youth hockey jerseys. In addition, announcements were made during the game acknowledging the HWAA weekend.

Whether or not professional hockey is where it's supposed to be in the hearts and minds of America is one thing. If the NHL has or has not recovered from its lockout those few years ago is unclear. What stands for certain though, is the strides the sport of hockey is making at the grass roots level in this country.

Over President's Day weekend, Feb. 13-15, Hyland Hills Hockey Association hosted USA Hockey Weekend across America. This newly annual event was initiated last year by USA Hockey as a way to celebrate the game and promote interest as well as participation to wider audiences and new fans.

Hyland Hills Hockey Association assumed responsibility and hosted Colorado's first year of participation in the hockey weekend. As geared primarily toward the youth, each of the three days had a different event to generate the growth of their involvement in hockey. On Friday a group of hockey representatives and coaches from different organizations went to Westminster Elementary and Stargate Elementary to play games of floor hockey and teach the students about the sport. It was officially themed jersey day. There was a competition to see which grade level and school had the most kids wearing hockey jerseys.

The Colorado Avalanche complied with the theme giving free tickets to jersey clad children with the purchase of an adult ticket to their Friday night game against the Canadians. The Colorado Rage did a similar promotion the following evening.

On Saturday at the Westminster Promenade Ice Center, HHA put on two different "one goal sessions" which are on-ice instruction to those who haven't had any experience playing hockey. Dave Evans, vice president for HHA, said that despite the rush to put the event together they had a very pleasing turnout. With over 50 people on the ice at one point, players from Denver University, Colorado University, and Colorado State University along with other volunteers gave hands-on lessons to over 30 children who had never been on skates with a hockey stick before. "For as late as we got started, I was very pleased with the response we had," said Evans. He explained that an average one-goal session will lead to further participation in one of their programs from about 25 percent of participants. He projected at least doubling that with these ones specifically, and said that at least 10 kids had already signed up for the summer program. Adam Millar, 9, and Alley Shea, 8, were two of the participants on Saturday. Though Millar has been playing for Hyland Hills six years, he said he learned how to pass and shoot better. His favorite thing about playing hockey is scoring. "It's really fun and it takes a lot of skill, that's why I like it," said Millar. As for Shea, she has never played before, but has always liked watching her brother Austin, 12, who plays for Hyland Hills Pewee AA. She said that after skating and learning more about hockey on Saturday that it was pretty easy and she'll probably play in the future. As the weekend continued on Sunday, local police and fire departments geared up to square off in a red versus blue hockey game. The two teams included collaborated participants of civil-service men and women from all around the Denver-Metro area. The police team won this game 3-2, but firefighter and goalie Bill Swenson of South Metro Fire Rescue said that the two teams get together to skate a few times a week and play pretty regularly. Hockey being an important part of their lives, Swenson said that it was an honor to participate in the USA Hockey Weekend across America. "We love giving back and we love being with the kids. Any chance to promote hockey," said Swenson. "Hockey's one of the best sports out there."
