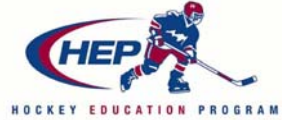




## HEP Parent Education 2007-08



The 2007 – 2008 HEP Parent Education is designed to:

- Be delivered as part of the parent team meeting (or smaller group meeting by level)
- Facilitated by the Association ACE Coordinator or someone else who is familiar with the materials to best lead the discussion.
- Target length 25 minutes
- For three levels
  - Parents of first year player who have not had any HEP training
  - Parent of Mite/8U players who do not play games with league standings where Fair Play applies
  - Parents of Squirt/10U players competing in games where Fair Play applies
