With snow on the ground and cold temperatures, it may be hard to think about baseball. But that's exactly what the in-house baseball Board has been doing! We're hard at work preparing for the upcoming season. It won't be long before registrations will be open...and if you can believe it, in just 4 months we'll be hitting the fields. Winter WON'T last forever!

WDBL (or **Woodbury Developmental Baseball League**) is WAA's in-house baseball program. Once again this year, we are offering a full range of programs starting with Pre-K (must be born before 9/1/2005) through seniors in high school. While we place much emphasis on developing baseball skills, we are open to players of all skill levels.

Every player that registers to play in-house baseball receives a top-quality uniform (hat, jersey, pants) and in 2nd grade and above, we also provide baseball socks and a belt. In addition, each team is issued high quality, age-appropriate equipment (bats, batting helmets, catcher's gear, etc.). All you need to provide is your fielding glove (although many players also buy baseball shoes too)!

When you register, be sure to specify the **GRADE YOUR CHILD IS CURRENTLY IN.**

As mentioned in my last newsletter article, the Board has added several new positions. We're excited about the opportunity to get more people involved in our program and we feel that these new positions will improve our ability to serve our members. We're still looking to fill many of these spots. I urge you to check out what we have available and then take the next step and get involved. With fall weather and snowflakes fast approaching, ones thoughts may not be focused on spring and its upcoming track program. However, spring sports sign-ups are just around the corner. Spring sports sign-ups, including track & field will take place in February. Watch the website for the opening spring sport sign-up dates and be sure to pay attention to when the late fee takes effect. All sport sign-ups are now done on-line.

WAA Track Program's mission is to enhance the skills of young runners and introduce them to the sport of Track & Field. The club has a goal of developing each person's leadership potential both on and off the track and field. The club is looking for kids who enjoy competing and have some interest in, track and field or just running to enhance their overall fitness.

Practice

Practices will be held twice a week for one hour (in the past practices have taken place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. The season will start in May and run into July as determined by the state meet date for 2010. The practice format provides flexibility for athletes that participate in other sports (i.e. soccer, softball, baseball) or activities (i.e., gymnastics or dance) that coincide with our season. The club asks that you attend all practices that you are able to but does not require attendance at every practice. Also families and athletes often have vacations or other plans that occur during the spring. The club attempts to keep our focus on sport in perspective, recognizing that family comes first.

Competition

Prior to the start of the track & field season, each participant will receive a "welcome" letter on-line, (or hard copy if requested) that outlines all of the available meets for us. Participants pick which meets they will attend, and participate in as many or as few meets as they choose.

Joining

On-line registration will begin February 1. You can register for either of the track programs (in-house or competitive) by going to our website at www.waa.woodbury.org and clicking on the "click here to register" prompt. If you do not have access to a computer, you may stop in the WAA office during regular operating hours to register (typically open Monday-Friday from 2:00 to 6:00 P.M.) But call 731-0100 to verify hours.

Most of our communications are sent via e-mail so please register with your current e-mail address. A Welcome Letter with additional information will be sent via e-mail in April.

Coaching Philosophy

The program is based on introducing and refining the sport of Track & Field through a positive feedback coaching process. This process emphasizes fundamentals, fitness, flexibility and form. Most important however, is the presentation of running as a fun, enjoyable, and rewarding athletic activity that can become a lifelong healthy lifestyle. If you are interested in coaching for the 2010 track season, please contact Corey Johnson as soon as possible, as we will have a coaches meeting in early March.

Cost of the Program

The cost of the program for the 2009 season was \$95.00 for the in-house program and \$125.00 for the traveling (competitive) program. January for actual costs and a cost breakdown for the upcoming season. This cost includes a running uniform, facility rental, the WAA administrative fees, fees for the WAA home meets, ribbons & end-of-season trophies as well as other incidentals.

PARENTAL SUPERVISION OF GYMS IS MANDATORY

Please discuss these reminders with your children:

1. Players are not to bring siblings or friends to a practice or game unless they will be under your supervision or the coach's supervision at all times. Siblings and friends must remain in the gym at **ALL** times.
2. Do not allow your children to walk or jump up on the protective padding at the end of the gyms. The schools do not want footprints left on the padding.
3. Do not bring your children to practice too early because they will not be able to get into the gyms. **The throwing or bouncing of balls in hallways or any area outside of the gyms is strictly prohibited.** This is a violation of Community Education's policies.
4. Children are not permitted to open or close locker doors on their way to or from the gyms. This is strictly prohibited.

Remember, WAA basketball players do not have a right to use the gyms. We must obey the Community Education policies. These policies were discussed at the parent's orientation meeting at the beginning of the season. They can also be found at <http://www.sowashco.k12.mn.us/comed/facility/default.htm>. Please review these rules again with your children. Their practices are in jeopardy if you do not make sure they are followed.

Please keep in mind that gym usage is not guaranteed. The WAA needs to maintain a good relationship and cooperate with the Community Education department in regards to using the gyms that they manage. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation in this very important matter!

**RESOLUTION FOR ADOPTION OF POLICY
ON POSITION OF AUTHORITY
CODE OF CONDUCT**

The Board of Directors of Woodbury Athletic Association (“WAA”) hereby adopt the following resolution as **Policy**.

WHEREAS, WAA is continually seeking to provide the best youth sports services to the youth of Woodbury;

WHEREAS, WAA is continually seeking to do what is in the best interest of the community and youth of Woodbury;

WHEREAS, WAA recognizes that some parents in Woodbury choose to place their child in youth sports organizations that directly compete against the services provided by WAA, and respect their right to make such a choice;

WHEREAS, WAA will not discriminate against any child or family that chooses a different youth sports organization than WAA, and openly welcomes back any family that chooses to return to WAA after playing at another competing youth sports organization without penalty to the family that left WAA;

WHEREAS, youth need to be protected against recruitment to competing youth sports organizations by coaches and others in positions of authority in WAA which could put a child in the untenable position;

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that the following resolution:

1. WAA adopts the following policy on recruiting as a code of conduct for those in positions of authority at WAA and all such persons will be required to sign the Code of Conduct attached hereto as Exhibit A:

“Definitions:

1. **Coach:** Coaches include but are not limited to designated coaches as recognized by the various Sport Specific Boards, or those acting as coach for the team, including an assistant, substitute or temporary coach/manager/advisor to the team at any game.

2. **WAA Director:** Refers to the Sport Specific Directors, Secretary, Treasurer and all other members of the Board of Directors of WAA.

3. **Team Managers:** Refers to persons who assist in the management of a sports team at WAA.

4. **WAA Sport Specific Board Member:** Refers to any member of a WAA Sport specific board of directors.

Conflicts of Interest: All WAA directors, Sport Specific Board members, Coaches, Assistant Coaches, Team managers and/or any person with team authority cannot actively recruit and/or influence WAA family members to leave and participate in another youth sports organization that competes directly with WAA. Final determination of a conflict of interest will be determined via meeting with the alleged party and the WAA Board.

This policy does not apply to those sports which youth do not have an opportunity to participate in with WAA because the program does not exist at WAA or the player is unable to participate due to an inability to field a team or player did not make a WAA team. Examples of no programs include but are not limited to: hockey and lacrosse.

Procedure for Reported Violations:

Upon report of a violation in writing to the Executive Director of WAA, the party alleged to have violated the conflict of interest policy shall attend the following meeting of the Board of WAA. The person alleged to have violated the Conflict of Interest policy shall admit or deny the allegation prior to or at said meeting. If the person is found to have intentionally violated the Conflict of Interest Rule by the Board, then the Board may institute the penalties below.

Penalty for non-compliance:

First Offense: Immediate Suspension of the person who is found to have violated the policy from holding any WAA director, Sport Specific Board position, coaching, team manager or other position of authority at WAA as well as barring the immediate family of the person violating the Conflict of Interest Rule from participating in all WAA programs, for one calendar year.

Second Offense: Immediate Suspension of the person who is found to have violated the policy from holding any WAA director, Sport Specific Board position, coaching, team manager or other position of authority at WAA as well as barring the immediate family of the person violating the conflict of Interest Rule from participating in all WAA programs, for three calendar years.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This resolution shall be effective for all WAA sports registrations beginning on January 1, 2010. Failure to comply after such time will result in a violation of the policy against Conflicts of Interest, and offenses will be treated swiftly and effectively.”

EXHIBIT A

CODE OF CONDUCT ON RECRUITING

The undersigned, having accepted a position of authority with WAA, hereby agrees to the following policy on Conflicts of Interest:

A. Definitions:

- 1. Coach: Coaches include but are not limited to designated coaches as recognized by the various Sport Specific Boards, or those acting as coach for the team, including an assistant, substitute or temporary coach/manager/ advisor to the team at any game.
- 2. WAA Director: Refers to the Sport Specific Directors, Secretary, Treasurer and all other members of the Board of Directors of WAA.

Team Managers: Refers to persons who assist in the management of a sports team at WAA.

- 4. WAA Sport Specific Board Member: Refers to any member of a WAA Sport specific board of directors.

B. Conflicts of Interest: All WAA directors, Sport Specific Board members, Coaches, Assistant Coaches, Team managers and/or any person with team authority cannot actively recruit and/or influence WAA family members to leave and participate in another youth sports organization that competes directly with WAA. Final determination of a conflict of interest will be determined via meeting with the alleged party and the WAA Board.

This policy does not apply to those sports which youth do not have an opportunity to participate in with WAA because the program does not exist at WAA or the player is unable to participate due to an inability to field a team or player did not make a WAA team. Examples of no programs include but are not limited to: hockey and lacrosse.

C. Procedure for Reported Violations:

Upon report of a violation in writing to the Executive Director of WAA, the party alleged to have violated the conflict of interest policy shall attend the following meeting of the Board of WAA. The person alleged to have violated the Conflict of Interest policy shall admit or deny the allegation prior to or at said meeting. If the person is found to have intentionally violated the Conflict of Interest Rule by the Board, then the Board may institute the penalties below.

D. Penalty for non-compliance:

First Offense: Immediate Suspension of the person who is found to have violated the policy from holding any WAA director, Sport Specific Board position, coaching, team manager or other position of authority at WAA as well as barring the immediate family of the person violating the Conflict of Interest Rule from participating in all WAA programs, for one calendar year.

Second offense: Immediate Suspension of the person who is found to have violated the policy from holding any WAA director, Sport Specific Board position, coaching, team manager or other position of authority at WAA as well as barring the immediate family of the person violating the Conflict of Interest Rule from participating in all WAA programs, for three calendar years.

I understand that the foregoing policy is applicable to me and to my family, and I agree to abide by this policy. I recognize that failure to comply with this policy may result in imposition of the penalties set forth above.

If I am a head coach, I also agree to obtain the signatures of my assistant coaches to a Code of Conduct.
