very proud of the numbers that continue to increase each year especially at the older ages.

The House Softball programs continues to have a strong backing although there is a program now formed at ERAA so we will have to see how this season plays out. The many hours that have gone into planning for the Spring softball season will now be directed toward the ball fields.

Spring Recreational Soccer continues to grow and is no longer just a place for kids that don't like Softball or Baseball, some people have their children play Spring Rec Soccer and that may be all they do. The volunteers for this program also spend countless hours over the winter getting ready for spring.

Track both Competitive and Recreational are small programs in numbers but their following is very strong and very involved in the planning process. Their members compete in some very prestigious events and the WAA Track program is well known in the area.

Once School gets out, the Golf program kicks in and the 5 golf courses that WAA uses spring to life with kids virtually of all ages hitting the links, the hope with this program is that these young people will develop life long activity skills that will help them lead a healthier life.

All of the Programs that WAA puts on the fields are organized by adult volunteers that have dedicated themselves to the positive future of the children of Woodbury, please take a minuet and thank anyone of them that you can identify.

With the addition of the East Ridge Athletic Association, the winter sports have had some difficulties in everyone getting the gym space that the teams want, Community Ed has formed a Facilities Task force to rewrite the gym space rules and regulations as they relate to distribution

of time. WAA is working closely with Community Ed , ERAA and, CGAA to make sure that the gyms that are available are made available to which ever association needs them. That task force has had two meetings and there will be several more before the summer when Community Ed will present their new Facilities policy to the School Board. Virtually the same process is underway with the City of Woodbury for field distribution as it relates to outdoor facilities.

The major portions of Bielenberg Sports center that have been under construction for the past three years will come on line for use this year. The addition of all of these fields has done little to help in the field pressure area, many of the fields that we doubled up on for the past three years are being taken out of service this year because the additional pressure that they received over the past three years has taken a heavy toll on them. Hopefully the City staff can get them up and running in usable fashion very soon. The WAA field schedulers are working overtime these days to try and make the Spring season work for all.

This Summer will bring some changes at Ojibway, Field number 1 that currently is used by the WHS Softball team as it's home varsity field will be reconstructed to bring it up to varsity standards. Dugouts will be added, irrigation will be installed and the infield will be regraded to allow for the proper drainage. This project is long over due and WAA has worked very hard with the School District and the City to bring this field to this standard. Please thank a School board member when you se them, they finally stepped up and took responsibility to provide the WHS girls and the children of Woodbury a premier facility. It will be fun to watch that happen.

The Board members at WAA are very interested to know what you think of what we are doing, we don't just want the bad stuff, if you see something you like let us know about that also. We are member driven and we are here to make your child's experience a positive one. You can email at WAAEXEC DIR@WAAWOODBURY.ORG with your thoughts about what we are doing, I will

respond to every comment that warrants comment.

Coaches, remember that WAA has a mandatory Coaches certification process, the certification is good for three years, if you took the class more than three years ago, or if you are new to coaching, go to the registration site and search for coaching classes as they are scheduled, they will be posted there.

Encourage Youth Football Players with Positive Feedback

Youth football coaches must encourage players to feel good about their contributions

Every player on a youth football team should feel he is an important part of the team's success, even though they might not share the same abilities and talents.

Longtime and highly successful coach Russ Jacques of the Strongsville High School football team, in Strongsville, Ohio, fully believes this coaching strategy.

Jacques understands that for younger kids to have the desire to continue competing in football, they must feel good about themselves. And they can't feel good about themselves with a football inferiority complex.

"A coach has to feel his way around that situation," Jacques says. "But every kid has to get some positive feedback. If he's not the best player physically, maybe he can be the kid who leads calisthenics or the kid who gets a little head start on a relay race and wins that. You want him to go home at the end of the day and tell his Dad, 'Hey, Dad, I was the guy that led calisthenics today!' You have to be positive."

Mini Camp - \$125

This is a half day camp. This camp is suitable for the new player and the more experienced player. Players will be coached in ability group regardless of their age.

Team Camp - \$150

This is a half day camp 4 day camp. Teams will be trained in a team environment that will promote greater team unity and help them achieve greater heights as a team. Staff coach will work with the team coach to design a specific curriculum designed to help the particular needs of the team and individual players.

This camp is a great opportunity to develop individual players and team spirit in an atmosphere that is designed specifically for the team taking into account adjusting the workload on particular days to insure maximum performance on game day.

Goal Keeper Camp - \$125

This is a half day camp 4 day camp. This camp is designed to help players continue to develop as a soccer player and learn the specialized skills of being the modern day goal keeper. Players will be trained by experienced Goal Keeper coaches.

Youth Camp - \$160

This is a full day camp. This camp is suitable for the more experienced player ready for a full day experience. Players will be coached in ability group regardless of their age.

Try-out Prep Camp - \$125

This camp prepares players for WSC Try-outs in August by putting them in environments similar to try-outs. Players will work with our evaluators at this camp so that come when they come to try-outs they will see friendly faces versus nameless evaluators.

Become A Member of the WAA Track Team or The Traveling Track Team!

Track is now registering online at waawoodbury.org. Most of our communications are sent via e-mail so please register with your current e-mail address. A Welcome Letter with additional information will be sent via e-mail in April.

WAA Track Program's mission is to enhance the skills of young runners and introduce them to the sport of Track & Field. The club has a goal of developing each person's leadership potential both on and off the track and field. The club is looking for kids who enjoy competing and have some interest in, track and field or just running to enhance their overall fitness.

Practice Practices will be held twice a week for one hour (in the past practices have taken place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7:00 P.M. The season will start in May and run into July as determined by the state meet date for 2010. The practice format provides flexibility for athletes that participate in other sports (i.e. soccer, softball, baseball) or activities (i.e., gymnastics or dance) that coincide with our season. The club asks that you attend all practices that you are able to but does not require attendance at every practice. Also families and athletes often have vacations or other plans that occur during the spring. The club attempts to keep our focus on sport in perspective, recognizing that family comes first.

Competition Prior to the start of the track & field season, each participant will receive a "welcome" letter on-line, (or hard copy if requested) that outlines all of the available meets for us. Participants pick which meets they will attend, and participate in as many, or as few meets as they choose.

Coaching Philosophy The program is based on introducing and refining the sport of Track & Field through a positive feedback coaching process. This process emphasizes fundamentals, fitness, flexibility and form. Most important however, is the presentation of running as a fun, enjoyable, and rewarding athletic activity that can become a lifelong healthy lifestyle. If you are interested in coaching for the 2010 track season, please contact Corey Johnson as soon as possible, as we will have a coaches meeting in early March.

Summer Camp

WAA is planning a summer volleyball camp during the first week in August. The camp is open to girls who will be in 3rd - 10th grade for the 2010/2011 school year and will be broken into three sections for age appropriate instruction. For the elementary girls (grades 3-5) fundamentals will be taught to prepare them for the fall recreation season. Middle school kids

(grades 6-8) will learn more advanced skills to prepare them for their fall school leagues and the winter competitive program. The high school girls (grades 9-10) session is geared to prepare them for the fall high school team tryouts.

We are still finalizing the coaching arrangements for the camp, the hours, and cost. More information will be in the May WAA newsletter. Camp registration will begin in May.

Fall Recreation League

The WAA fall recreational volleyball league is for girls entering grades 3-6 in the fall of 2010.

There will typically be one practice per week, with games on Saturday. Registration will begin in June, and the season will start in September. We will need volunteer parent coaches for our rec teams and all coaches will need to attend an ASEP Sport neutral coaching class. Seventh and eighth grade girls interested in playing fall volleyball should sign up with South Washington County Schools Community Education, which forms teams at each middle school.
