Jamie Revard is a Senior Major Gifts Officer in the Rotary Foundation's Fund Development Division. She has been with them since 2002. Jamie is a former Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar sponsored by District 6440 (Chicago) where she studied in a castle in Scotland. Jamie tells how

her roommates provided her with a needed education in diverse cultures and geography. She went on to join the Peace Corp with her husband Brian and served in Yugoslavia and Japan.

Jamie is very thankful to Rotary and its members for providing the opportunity for a kid from the North Shore of Chicago a chance to be adventurous and "do what you didn't think you could do". The Rotary scholarship changed her life.

Jamie went on to define the difference between Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation. RI is the charitable arm of the Foundation. Through the SHARE System, 100% of your contributions go towards Rotary programs: 50% to the World Fund and 50% to District Designated Funds. The money is not distributed for 3 years while the interest accumulates and pays for Rotary staff and overhead.

Jamie encouraged everyone to continue supporting TRF, especially the End Polio Now campaign. She reminded us that Polio has been around for thousands of years and we have only been fighting it for 20. We are so close and we must keep fighting.
