

2011 MAYLA BOYS SELECT RULES

All NFHS/US Lacrosse Rules apply, except where noted below:

Recommended Timing:

Normal Time: Recommended for single games
 10 minute stop time
 All normal rules on stop time apply (Out of bounds, face offs, time outs, etc)
 2 minute quarter breaks, 10 minute half time break.

Tournament Style: Recommended for a round robin / or multiple games on one day.
 12 minutes quarters, clock never stops with a 2 minute quarter breaks
 (Total of 54 minutes, games on the hour)

2011 MAYLA BOYS SELECT RULES

Sudden Victory Overtime – In the event of a tie at the end of the regulation game, play shall be continued after a two minute intermission with sudden victory overtime. The teams shall play periods of four minutes until a goal is scored. Play shall be stop clock. First team that scores wins. Each team gets one timeout per overtime period. Two minute intermission between sudden overtime periods.

Spectators – Minimum of 6 yards away from field (on opposite side of the field when available) and away from the end lines. Spectators are not permitted in the coach's box or directly behind the score table or player's bench area. Behavior of the parents and fans is a team responsibility. Teams need to promote good sportsmanship and manage the team, parents and fans.

Rosters – Select Team Rosters are to be limited to only those players attending middle schools that feed the team's respective high school program (e.g. no travel or all star teams). Each Coach will have player rosters that include name, jersey numbers & current grade the player is in. This will be required to be sent to the Select MAYLA Director by 2/15/2011. Coaches will carry rosters and can be inspected by the opponents coach prior to each game.

Age Requirements:

Senior Select: 7th and 8th grades.

Junior Select: 6th and 7th, no 8th graders allowed.

Roster Moves: A 7th grade player can be moved once up or down from the Jr. Select Team to the Sr. Select Team and that is considered a final roster move. Players cannot be moved back and forth between rosters during the season. Any exceptions to the above would require review and permission from the League Director.

Fouling Out

Any player who accumulates Five Personal Fouls is disqualified from the remainder of the game.

Expulsion

Any player, coach, or non-playing member of the team who is involved in fighting, deliberately striking or attempting to strike anyone or leaving the bench during an altercation shall be disqualified for the remainder of the current game and the next game.

Any player, coach, or non-playing member of the team who receives a second non-releasable unsportsmanlike foul shall be disqualified for the remainder of the current game and the next game.

The officiating assigning authority is responsible for notifying MAYLA of the gamer expulsion.

Ref Fees & Scheduling – Home teams pay for ref fees. If teams want to split fees if they only play once, that needs to be discussed and agreed to prior to the game.

PLAYOFFS:

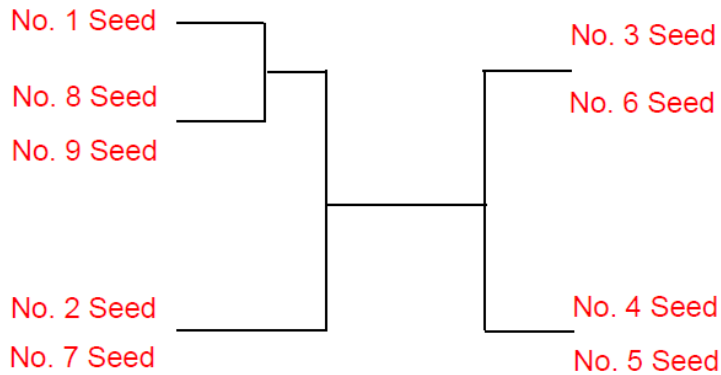
Both the Junior and Senior Boys Select Leagues will have a nine (9) team, single elimination tournament. Championship Games will be played on **Sunday, May 8, 2011** at Sharon Springs Park.

- Junior Select Championship Game – 2:00 pm
- Senior Select Championship Game – 4:00 pm

Championship rainout dates: TBD (Likely Monday May 9th)

The best “In-Region” divisional records for the top 2 teams per region make the playoffs, plus one at large Wild Card team. If division records are tied, team with the best record against each other makes it in the playoffs. If the games were “split”, a playoff game will take place between the two teams to select the team that advances.

Bracket seeding is based on best overall records with ties decided by coin flip.



Wild Card team (No. 9 Seed) is chosen on the best overall record of the remaining teams. If the overall record is tied, then head to head record against each other will decide the Wild Card winner. If Wild Card Teams are still tied, the teams can conduct a playoff game. If a Wild Card Playoff game cannot be conducted in a timely basis (e.g. inclement weather), then a coin-flip will be used to decide the Wild Card team.

Quarters and Semi Finals will be played the week of May 2nd. These playoff games will be hosted by the team with the highest seed. Quarter-finals must be played no later than Thursday May 5th. Semi-finals must be played no later than Saturday, May 7th. Home team is responsible for coordinating and paying for game officials but will collect 50% of the officiating fee from the visiting team

Score Posting:

It is the winning teams responsibility to e-mail the scores to the Boys Select League Director by the following Monday. The Select League Director will collect the records and scores and post them on the MAYLA website. League standings will also be posted.
