

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I register after July 15th but want monthly credit card terms?

The first payment will be adjusted to get you caught up to an July 15th start date and then each payment after that will be a normal payment.

Example: You register a Peewee on Sept. 12th and have a registration balance of \$500. You choose the monthly credit card payment plan that splits your payments to be made the 15th of every month, ending December 15th. Your first payment would be \$250 on Sept. 15th, and the rest would be \$83.33 on the 15th of Oct., Nov., and Dec.

*Had you registered on or before July 15th there would have been 6 equal payments of \$83.33. Had you registered on Sept. 29th the first payment on Oct. 15th would have been \$333.33 with a payment of \$83.33 in Nov. and again in Dec.

**The system gets you caught up with the first payment and then takes out equal payments through the end date allowed by BYHA of December 15th.

What are my payment options?

- A. Pay in full at time of registration by check or cash.
- B. Pay ½ at time of registration (check or cash), ½ on or before December 15th.
- C. Choose one of the credit card options on-line.

What if I don't want to put my credit card on-line or don't have a credit card to use to register?

You need to come to BYHA registration night to be registered as an "orphan" by one of the BYHA board members. We will use a designated credit card to pay for and obtain your USA Hockey number and proceed to register your skater for the season. You will then need to pay that evening by option A. or option B. as mentioned above.

Do I have to be a member of USA Hockey?

Yes. This is required by every hockey organization for insurance purposes. This cost is **IN ADDITION** to your BYHA registration cost and must be completed before you can proceed with your BYHA registration process.

What if I agree to fundraise to get the discount and don't complete my fundraising obligation?

By law, you **MUST** turn in all of the ticket stubs you were issued. If they are not all accounted for by BYHA the Gambling Board views this as theft and we may not have this option to offer in the future to help you pay for hockey. You are then responsible to pay for the difference of whatever has not been sold as this is still part of your registration cost.

What happens if I don't pay by December 15th or I don't turn in my fundraising items by that time?

It is the policy of the BYHA Board that your skater will not be allowed on the ice after December 15th until payment is complete.

What if more than one person is helping pay for the hockey fees and selling calendars?

Due to the number of players in our organization we cannot ask our treasurer to track this. Whoever the responsible adult is that registered the player will be solely responsible for securing the fees (including calendar stubs/money) and turning it in as stated above. Calendar stubs must be turned in all at once for each skater and any splitting of fees will need to be handled by the parties involved. The treasurer will not handle multiple customers per player.
