PLAYER EVALUATIONS

Another year brings another round of changes. With USA Hockey recommending a transition from Mite Hockey to Red, White and Blue leagues there will no longer be Mite sessions.

This leaves only Squirts and Peewees in need of a traditional evaluation session as Bantams go through a completely different process as outlined below. These additional changes also mean a reduction in the amount of ice Southwest needs to conduct tryouts. This reduction in the amount of ice needed and in an effort to be fiscally prudent we have also structured the goalie evaluations so that they will share ice time with the other skaters.

I am confident these changes are in the best interest of all the skaters at Southwest and I encourage any parent that has questions to please reach out to me at any time.

A common theme within the membership, as it pertains to the evaluation process, has been communication. To address this, I will be providing several opportunities to discuss the evaluation process. The first opportunity will be during preseason conditioning.

I, along with one other board member, will be available in the mezzanine during the first on-ice conditioning time for each level. During this time, it will be an open forum to ask questions about, and get clarification on, the evaluation process. All parents are welcome to drop in at any time that works for them.

The second opportunity will be after evaluations have concluded. I, along with one other board member, will be available in the mezzanine during each team's first on-ice practice to discuss your individual skater's evaluation process. This is a time for parents to get feedback on each skater's strengths and weaknesses.

Our hope is that this feedback will help all of our families by giving skaters areas to focus on for improvement, and positive encouragement on what they do well.

Skater Evaluations

Like last season, evaluations will consist of 3 on-ice sessions. Following is an outline of each of these sessions.

Skills (1 session, 1/3 of total evaluation score)

Players will be evaluated in five equally weighted categories: forward skating, backward skating, stops and starts, puck control, and passing and shooting. Some of the drills that the players will be asked to perform may have changed from prior seasons. The goal is to better provide drills that are more challenging in nature, but will allow the player to shoot, pass and stickhandle more than in the past. This will also give our evaluators more chances to see each player demonstrate their hockey skills.

Scrimmages

(2 sessions, 2/3 of total evaluation score)

During each scrimmage, players are evaluated on their overall hockey performance, with equal weight given to offensive and defensive awareness and expertise, in each controlled scrimmage. You will notice that the word awareness is used. The reason behind this is simple.

Over 95% of the time a player is on the ice during a game situation, the puck is not on his/her stick. With this in mind, we believe it is important to evaluate what players do without the puck, as well as with it. We also believe this system of evaluation will encourage more complete, and better overall team play.

- **3 vs. 3 Scrimmage** (1/3 of total evaluation score).

This session will be a scrimmage that includes all players in a specific age classification using a 3 vs. 3 reduced surface format.

- **5 vs. 5 Scrimmage** (1/3 of total evaluation score).

This session will be a scrimmage that includes all players in a specific age classification using a 5 vs. 5 full-ice format.

Goalie Evaluations

Similar to the skater evaluation process, the goalie evaluation process will consist of three sessions.

All sessions are weighted equally, with each session accounting for 1/3 of the player's total evaluation score. The first session will be a skills session and the second and third will be the scrimmage sessions. All will be held at the same time as the sessions for the age division.

- **Skills** (1/3): The player is graded on the skills of angles, glove/pad saves, use of stick, puck control (rebounds) and movement/reactions.

- **Scrimmages** (2/3): The player will be evaluated on overall performance in a game situation in both scrimmages for their age level.

Only Squirt and Peewee goalies should attend the evaluation sessions for goalies. Bantam goalies will have approximately a month to show their skills. See Bantams on next page.

Player Evaluations continued

Bantams

This age group will not go through the SWE evaluation process used at other age levels. All Bantam players will be assigned to a Southwest Bantam pre-season team. A best effort will be made to divide the players into equally matched pre-season teams.

Coaches of the pre-season teams, with oversight from the Coaches Committee, will be evaluating skaters during pre-season practices and games. After all area High School evaluations have concluded (approx. Nov. 10th), the Southwest Bantam evaluations will conclude, and the players will be placed on a team for the season.

Play-Up Policy

With the elimination of the Mite program this year and the transition to the Red, White and Blue leagues, it is important that we revisit the clubs "play-up" policy.

- The policy for skating at a higher age classification is for players that have demonstrated exceptional skills and by playing up they will have the opportunity to compete at a level that is appropriate for their skill level.
- Players requesting to play up must obtain a recommendation from the Coaches Committee and notify the appropriate Division Director by the first Sunday in September. A player

will be allowed to tryout at the older age classification unless the Board of Directors determines that it will adversely affect team sizes at either age classification.

- All requests to play up require the parent, player and ACE Director signatures.
- The Southwest Eagles Youth Hockey Association will allow a player to play up one age group, if after participating in tryouts at the older classification, the player's total tryout score is in the top five for that older classification. If the player's total tryout score is not in the five for the older classification the player will be placed on a team at their age classification. The Southwest Board of Directors may make exemptions to this policy if a majority vote of the Board decides that the situation warrants special consideration due to number of skaters at each of the age divisions affected.

The Southwest Board is responsible for the success of the entire organization and will consider the effects of adding a player to a team before granting permission to any player to tryout for a higher level.

COACHES' CORNER

Joe Taylor – Association Coaching & Education Director

Planning for the upcoming season has once again started, and the Coaches Committee is in the process of organizing pre-season sessions, evaluations, practice plans, and skills clinics. Our staff of over fifty coaches is dedicated to helping our kids learn to play and love the great game of hockey. Our goal is to improve as players, as coaches, as teams, and as a club.

Changes to the USA Hockey Coaching CEP program

Significant changes have been made to the USA Hockey Coaching CEP program for the 2011 – 2012 season. USA Hockey no longer requires a specific certification level based on the age level of play coaching. A coach must progress through the education system every year and have completed the online age-specific module for each age level coaching. A summary of the changes is included below. Please note the grandfather clause, which applies to any coaches that have existing valid CEP certification.

- a)** All coaches must enter USA Hockey's Coaching Education Program at Level 1, and must continue their education each year until, at a minimum, they achieve Level 3. A coach may attend only one (1) certification clinic per year (not including age-specific requirements). Coaches who do not coach in continuous years must re-enter the program at the next level when they resume coaching responsibilities. Once Level 3 is achieved, periodic renewal [as outlined in Paragraph (c) below] is required for coaches who have not achieved Level 4. Coaches of Tier 1 and Tier II (National Tournament Bound) 14U, 16U, and 18/19U teams must complete Level 4 in their fourth season of coaching. Coaches who attain Level 4 certification are not required to attend any further certification clinics but must adhere to the age-specific requirement as outlined in Paragraph (b) below.
- b)** In addition to the training in paragraph (a) above, coaches must also complete age-specific training components specific to the level of play they are coaching, if they have not already taken that component. This requirement applies to all coaches at all levels, 1 through 5. Coaches may complete more than one age-specific component in any given season.
- c)** Coaching certification at Level 3 is valid for two (2) seasons, as indicated by the expiration date on the Level 3 sticker.
- A coach whose Level 3 is due to expire must take the online Level 3 Recertification Track 1 curriculum or they may move up to Level 4. Level 3 Track 1 Recertification is valid for two (2) seasons.
 - A coach whose Track 1 Level 3 recertification is due to expire must take the online Level 3 Recertification Track 2 curriculum or move up to Level 4. Level 3 Track 2 Recertification is valid for two (2) seasons.
 - Coaches whose Track 2 Level 3 Recertification is due to expire must attend a Level 4 clinic prior to the expiration of their Level 3 Recertification.
 - Coaches must complete the online recertification program in order to recertify their Level 3 certifications. Attending a clinic or workshop is no longer valid for recertifying any certification level.

Year 3 (ex: 2013-14)	Level 3 clinic (expires Dec. 31, 2015) + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 4 (ex: 2014-15)	No Level certification required but can attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 5 (ex: 2015-16)	Complete the online Level 3 Recertification Track 1 (expires Dec. 31, 2017), or attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 6 (ex: 2016-17)	No Level certification required but can attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 7 (ex: 2017-18)	Complete the online Level 3 Recertification Track 2 (expires Dec. 31, 2019), or attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 8 (ex: 2018-19)	No Level certification required but can attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 9 (ex: 2019-20)	Must attend a Level 4 clinic + age-specific component if not previously taken for current age level
Year 10 and beyond	No Level recertification required but must complete age specific component if not previously taken for current age level. Coaches are highly encouraged to attend a continuing education course every two years.



d) Grandfather Clause: For coaches who enrolled in the Coaching Education Program prior to May 1, 2011, their entry into the above program will be at their current certification level. Level 1 and 2 coaches must adhere to paragraphs (a) and (b) above, effective May 1, 2011. Current Level 3 coaches must adhere to paragraph (b) and (c) above; effective with the season their Level 3 expires.

The chart on the previous page outlines the progression for a new coach. Coaches with pre-existing certifications will enter the new program at their current certification level and must adhere to paragraphs 1. (a) and (b) above.

USAH Coaching Clinics will be held throughout the state from September through December and coach certifications must be recorded on the official team roster that is submitted to WAHA. After December 31, no uncertified coaches will be allowed to participate in practices or games. Due to the changes in the requirements and program going into effect for the 2011-12 season, registration and schedule for all Level 1-3 clinics will not be available until the end of August or beginning of September. A schedule of for the Wisconsin CEP clinics, with registration information will be sent out as soon as it is available.

Given the extensive changes to the CEP program, Southwest will determine a reimbursement policy once USA Hockey publishes cost information for the new program.

Coaching Registration

In addition to certification, all coaches are required to register with USA Hockey each season. Log on to www.usahockey.com, register as a coach, pay the fee, and print the confirmation page. A copy of the confirmation page should be put in the ACE Director mailbox at the rink or e-mailed to ace@southwesteagles.com. The club will reimburse the registration fee for Coaches that have been assigned a position for the 2011-2012 season; contact the ACE director to request reimbursement. **We recommend that Coaches wait until they have been assigned a position for the 2011-2012 season before registering with USA Hockey.**

In-house Coaching Clinic

Our annual in-house coaching clinic will be held in late September at the Nest. The focus will be on teaching coaches how to teach hockey skills, organize effective practices, and make the experience fun for the kids. All Southwest coaches should plan to attend this fun and informative evening.

Coaching Assignments

NEW COACHES to Southwest are required to submit a SWE Application to Coach. The SWE Application to Coach form is available on the Southwest Eagles Website in the Coaching section under the Coaching at Southwest tab.

ALL COACHES at Southwest are required to complete the Background Check and Waiver form/process, and Coach's Code of Conduct form. These forms are also available on the Southwest Eagles Website in the Coaching section under the Coaching at Southwest tab. The Background check is completed by a WAHA assigned vendor and valid for two seasons. A valid background check is required prior to coaching assignment.

Tier 2, Div 1 Teams (Squirt A/B/C, Pee wee A/B/C, Bantam A/B, HS2)

If you are interested in coaching with one of the WAHA Tier 2 teams at Southwest, contact the ACE Director. Indicate the team or age level and position (Head, Assistant, or either) you are interested in. Any information provided regarding your coaching experience, philosophy, and/or references are optional, but useful and appreciated. This information will be taken into consideration by the Coaches Committee during the coaching assignment process. Recommendations are made by the Coaches' Committee to the Board of Directors for final approval. The Coaches' Committee considers coaching experience, philosophy, past performance, as well as prior parent and coach feedback when making their coaching assignment recommendations.

Since most of our coaches are parents, selections cannot be made until tryouts are complete. If you or someone you know would like to coach at Southwest this season give me a call at 663-4577 or e-mail me at ace@southwesteagles.com. All applicant information and enquiries will be forwarded on to the SWE Coaches Committee.

RWB and Recreational Program Teams Coaching assignment recommendations are made by the appropriate age level director (ALD), and are submitted to the Coaches' Committee for review and the Board of Directors for final approval. For further info, contact your Age Level Director or the ACE Coordinator.

The 2nd annual "Nest Fest" at the Eagles Nest Ice Arena will take place August 19th - 21st 2011. Last year's event was such a huge success and so much fun; we want to do it again!

The Rink is in need of continuing financial support, from the Clubs and community, to help recover from these overwhelming expenses and make improvements in the future.

Nest Fest will be full of activities that should entertain all ages. The festivities are kicked off on Friday evening with food, games, softball, ice skating, and live music at the Eagles Nest Grounds. The celebration will continue thru Sunday. A youth 3v3 hockey tournament will take place throughout the weekend, as well as a 5K Run on Sunday morning. These great events are sure to draw hundreds of families to the Verona area and the Eagles Nest during the weekend.

We are very proud of the facility that we call home. Like any nonprofit group, the Eagles Nest operates on a very tight budget.
