What do the designations B, A, AA, and AAA mean?

At each youth hockey age group, there are three distinct classifications: B/BB, A/AA and AAA.

B or BB (House) is a recreational level with the following requirements.

- No tryouts
- Everyone plays
- Teams are formed by drafts
- Teams are limited to the number of second year players on a team according to the MAHA formula
- Ages 15-18 are restricted to a maximum of 40 games before Feb. 1 (not including District playoffs)
- Ages 9-14 are restricted to a maximum of 35 games before Feb. 1 (not including District playoffs)
- Ages 8 and under are restricted to playing a maximum of 40 games per season

A or AA (Tier 2) is a competitive level with the following requirements.

- Teams are formed by tryouts
- Limited to players within their districts with a maximum of 3 players from outside their district (Midget classification is allowed 6 players out of district)
- Ages 9 and older are restricted to playing a maximum of 75 games per season
- Ages 8 and under are restricted to playing a maximum of 40 games per season

AAA (Tier 1) is a competitive level with the following requirements.

- This is a top level of play
- Teams are formed by tryouts
- Players can come from anywhere in the state and even outside the state
- Ages 9 and older are restricted to playing a maximum of 75 games per season
