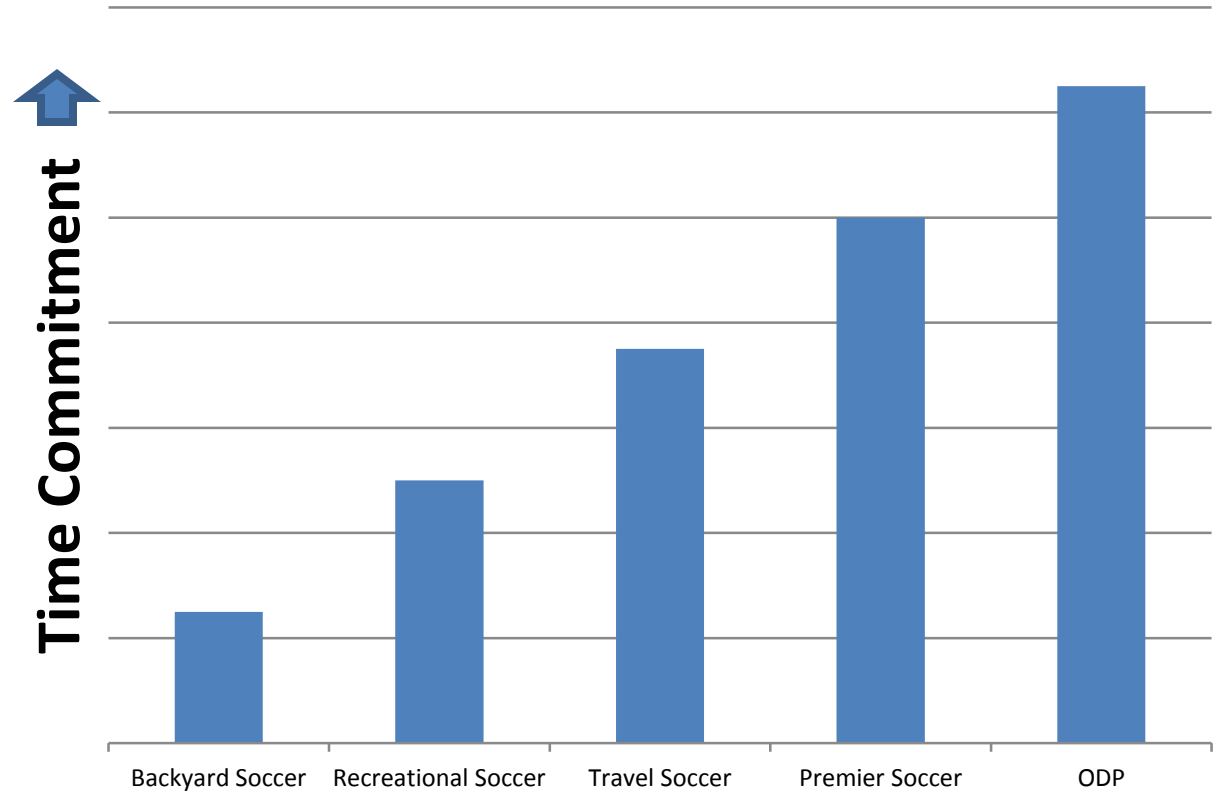


# Club Purpose

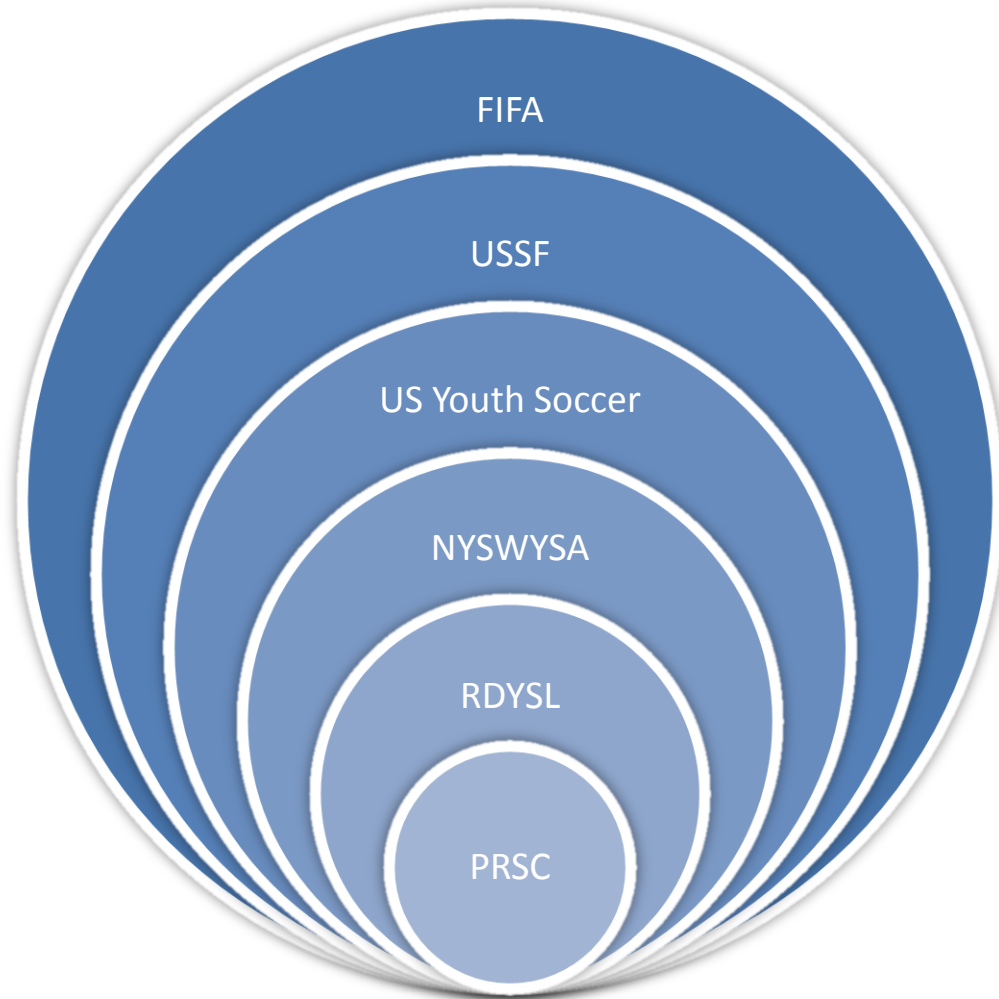
- *To foster, teach and promote the game of soccer within the Town of Penfield by developing exceptional players through the age of 19 years.*

- 17 teams
  - Three U9; Two U10
  - Three Division 1
  - Four Division 2
  - Five Lower Divisions
- 282 players
- Results
  - No first place teams
  - One second place team (U14 A Jacobson)
  - Most teams solidly in the middle of division

- Micro Program at Eastside YMCA

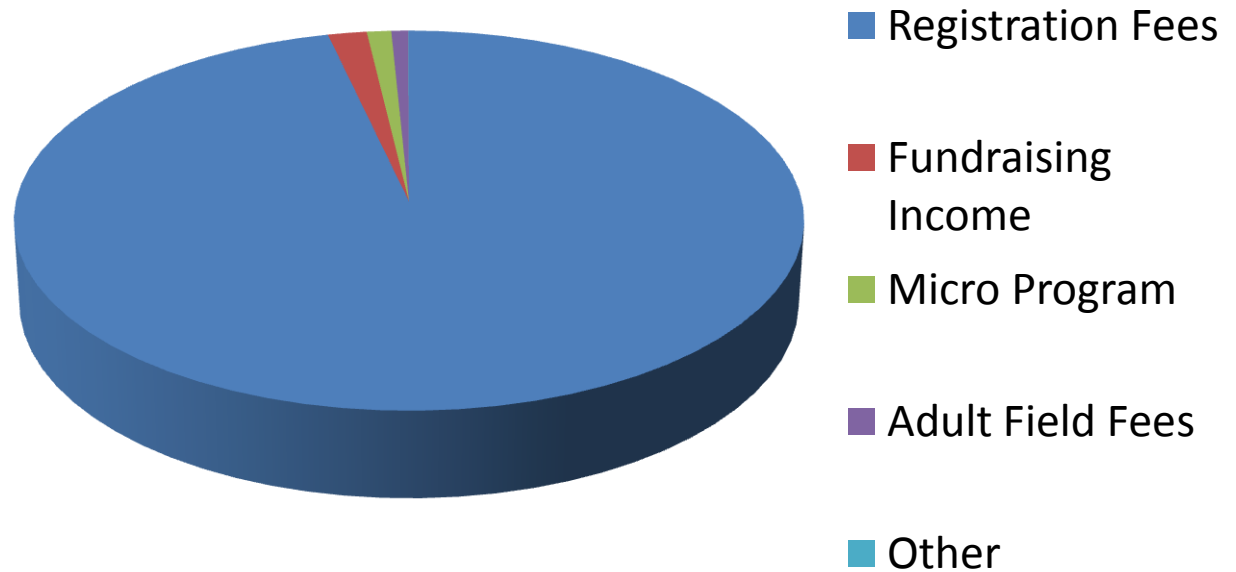


# Lowlights

- Club was assessed \$1007.50 in fees/fines
  - \$30 Field-related
  - \$207.50 Administrative
  - \$470 Forfeits (Two games)
  - \$25 Player Yellow Cards (28)
  - \$200 Player Red Cards (4)
  - \$75 Coach / Spectator Minor Offense

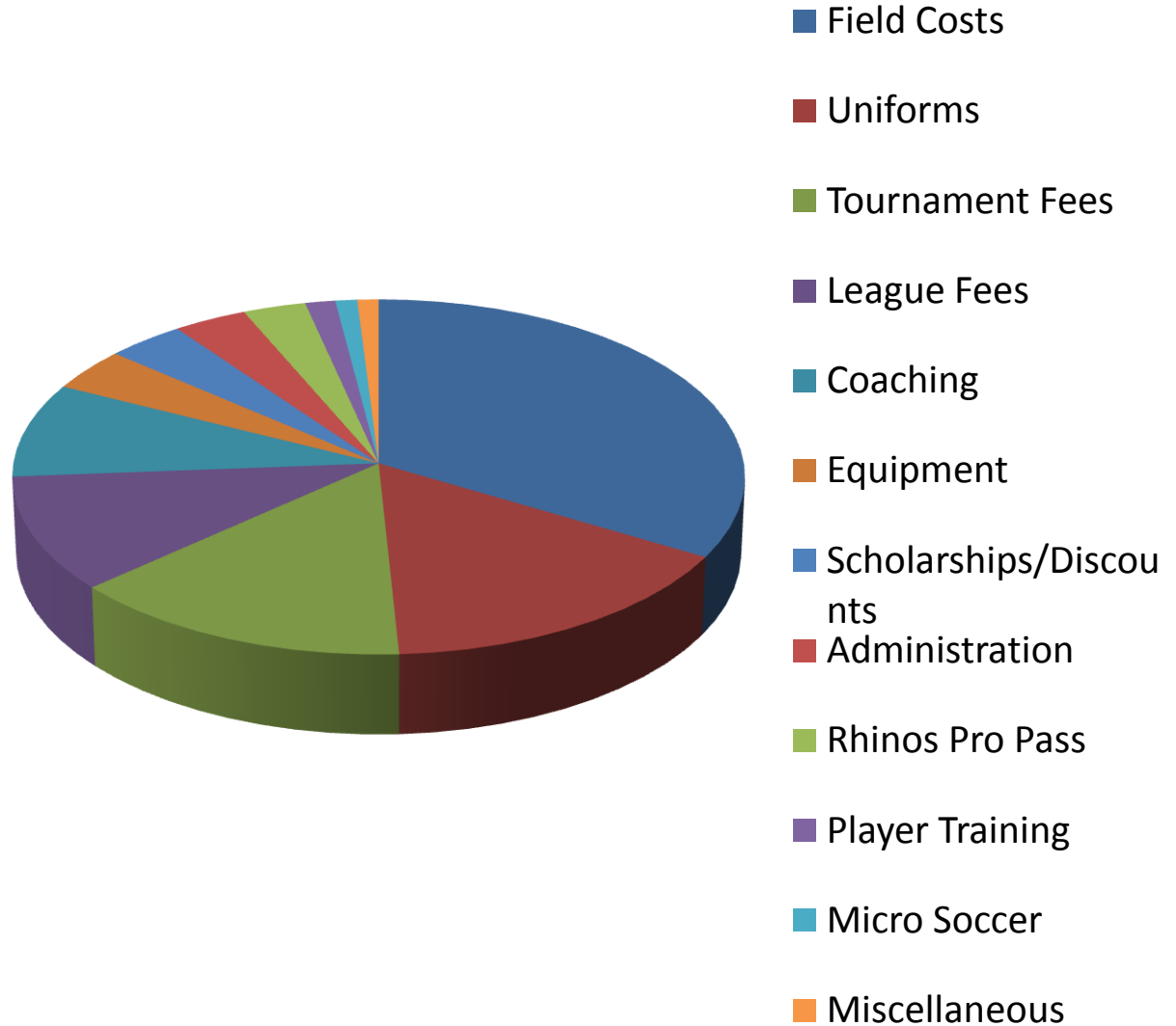


Total Income

# New Academy Program

- Focus on individual ball skills using small-sided games
- Professional Coach from NYPS with parent Assistant Coaches
- Games against other Academy program
- 29 Players



# Teams

- Fifteen Teams
  - One team: U9, U12, U14, U16, U17, U19
  - Two teams: U11, U13, U15
  - Three teams: U10
- 232 Players
- Division placements requested in January



# Indoor Training

- Once a week from November through April
- Academy – one hour session
- U9-U17 – two hour session
  - Team Training
  - Skills Training
- Teams will have a bye week every four weeks
- Schedule will be posted online on team calendar

# Increased Fee for 2012

- Why the increase in registration fee?
  - Fewer players
  - Avoid drawing from reserves
  - Transfer credit card processing fees
  - Outdoor field costs from last season
  - Expenses will be higher for this season
    - New York Premier Soccer (up \$6000)
    - Indoor field cost (up \$5000)
    - Rhinos Pro-Pass (\$2500)
    - Turf Costs (up \$500)

# Things to Remember

- What Does My Player Need For Training?
  - Age-appropriate soccer ball
  - Shin guards
  - Soccer shoes
    - Turf shoes or sneakers for indoor
    - Cleats for outdoor
  - Water bottle
- “On-Time” means ready to go when training is scheduled to start

1. Cheer
2. Relax and Let Them Play
3. Yelling Directions = Distraction
4. Remember, They Are Your Kids
5. Have Reasonable Expectations
