Where: at the Eagles Club, Hwy 169 South

An Extra What: volunteer(s) need to report to the pull tab booth worker.

Volunteer(s) will then be shown a step-by-step picture book of the raffle process.

Any questions during the meat raffle can be directed to the pull tab worker or the wait/bar staff. They are all very nice people and are willing and ready to help.

Remember...they are used to having people come in to help out that have never done the raffle before.

Other Info:

- At least one parent or volunteer that is 18 yrs. old, or older, is needed per shift. Hockey players are also welcome to come and help!
- If volunteer(s) can show up at 4:50-4:55, that'd be great because they can review the picture-instruction book and still be able to start the raffle at 5:00. If volunteer(s) are not able to start until 5:15, that's okay too. The Eagles staff are very flexible about start time—*they would rather someone come and start the raffle a little late than having no one come to do the raffle at all.* If volunteer(s) will be a little late, please have them call the Eagles to tell them your ETA..again, it's okay if you're late, but just make sure *someone* shows up. Eagles.....326-4845. The raffle usually takes about an hour. Almost always, the volunteer(s) is done before 6:00 pm.
