## **From The President**

Welcome to the Rochester Youth Baseball Season of 2012! It won't be long until we are all out enjoying a game of baseball in 80 degree weather! RYBA is continuing over a half-century tradition of providing authentic youth baseball programs to the Rochester Community.

RYBA is a non-profit organization operated by dedicated individuals who serve on our Board of Directors with the goal of providing great baseball programs for the kids of Rochester. These individuals volunteer hundreds of hours of their time year-round to our program. Many of you may not realize that some of our Board's busiest times are during the winter and early spring as we prepare for the upcoming season. Please appreciate all the time these individuals are putting in to make Rochester Youth baseball the successful program it is today. Thank you also to all the coaches who volunteer their time to teach both the game and the skills of baseball to your kids.

RYBA now has a very strong online presence. This will mark our first year that we will be doing all registration online. Therefore, there will NOT be in-person registration at the REC Center in late January. We are now live for online registration at rybamn.com. This online registration still allows payment options including payment by check (via postal mail after entering player info online), credit card, or paypal®. For those families with limited or no online access, there will be one night of LIMITED registration at the RCTC Field House on February 26<sup>th</sup> from 6:30-8:00. At our website there is also a very detailed Q & A section to answer many of the questions you may have concerning our program.

Based on feedback from our yearly survey, RYBA has decided to not have any fundraiser cards for the 2012 season. We thank the businesses who have been a part of the coupon cards in past years.

Another big change is the new bat requirements that are now mandatory for those playing in RYBA. The changes started at the collegiate level and have since moved down to the High School and youth leagues. *“The new standard ensures that performances by non-wood bats are more comparable to those of wood bats. It's also expected to minimize risk, improve play and increase teaching opportunities”*. A primary reason for the change was safety in that balls were coming off the composite bats so quickly that it was difficult for pitchers and third baseman to react quickly enough. RYBA is also mandating the use of these bats in its league play. At ages where there is an umpire, the bats will be inspected for compliance. When looking for a new bat be sure that they are in compliance with the new rule. All the sporting goods stores are aware of the new requirements and can assist you. Most bats from 2011 or before will not be “legal” in 2012, but see our website for specific marking to look for to determine which bats are eligible.

Finally, it is the mission of RYBA to have our players develop as baseball players and as individuals- hence our motto is "Youth Growing Through Baseball". To advance this mission all involved in youth baseball- coaches, parents, spectators should abide by the adaptation of the Golden Rule- Treat the players, coaches or umpires as you would want your family, especially your child, to be treated. One area where this especially holds true is the treatment of umpires. Many of our umps are young adults who usually have a love for the game and enjoy umping youth sports. They, like all umpires, make mistakes. Just ask Armando Galarraga of the Detroit Tigers who pitched a “perfect game” only to have an umpire error take this away from him. Though stunned and mad at first, Galarraga ended up handling the situation with an amazing grace. Let us all realize that mistakes will be made, and before yelling at an ump, ask if that was your son out there umping, would you want someone yelling at him?

Let's have fun, still strive to win, and make this a great summer of baseball!

## **WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PLAY**

All boys and girls that are **CURRENTLY** in Grades K through 8 are eligible to play.

## **REGISTRATION FEES AND REFUND POLICIES**

**Grades K -3 : \$90** (additional \$25 late fee after April 1, 2012). No refunds for K-3 after May 1, 2012

Requests for refunds for Grades K-3 received prior to May 1, 2012 may be considered and if approved by the RYBA treasurer will be reduced by a \$25 processing fee.

**Grades 4-8: \$130** which includes a \$10 Park & Rec fee (additional \$25 late fee after March 1, 2012). No refunds for Grades 4-8 after April 1, 2012. Requests for refunds for Grades 4-8 received prior to April 1, 2012 may be considered and if approved by the RYBA treasurer will be reduced by a \$25 processing fee.

## **HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE 2012 SEASON**

For 2012, all registration will be ONLINE thru our RYBA website. Online registration began on January 1, 2012. Once you have registered online you may either pay the fees ONLINE or you can elect to mail it in to RYBA at PO Box 6631, Rochester, MN 55903.

If you do not have access to a computer to register ONLINE, we will have a limited number of computers available on Sunday Feb 26<sup>th</sup> from 6:30PM – 8PM at the UCR Field House for you to use to register ONLINE.

### **HOUSE LEAGUE:**

At the 4<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade, we will have both major and minor divisions. We have set up some fun and exciting changes as well to our K-3 programs. Basically, we are moving things so that real baseball is played at earlier ages without umpires.

### **DONATIONS TO RYBA:**

### **2012 EQUIPMENT:**

RYBA will be supplying caps and uniform T-shirts to all players. Each player must also provide a, glove and appropriate shoes. Rubber or plastic cleats are recommended, but not required. Metal cleats can be worn in 8th grade only. Players in grades 2-8 will be responsible for supplying their own navy or black "NOCSAE stamped" batting helmet, gray pants and black belt. RYBA uniform code will apply.

You will need to submit the Free and Reduced Lunch Information about your player. You will be provided with information on how to register online after we have received your information. Please note that financial assistance is only available for House league and not for the Traveling program.

**2012 TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL PICTURES:** Varsity Photos will again take RYBA photos this year. Individual and team photos will be available for purchase. Varsity donates a portion of all sales back to RYBA.

**RYBA SCHOLARSHIPS:** RYBA offers \$4,000 in scholarships towards post-High School education. Awards range from \$250 up to \$1000. All applications must be submitted by March 31, 2012. Winners will be based on specific criteria, please refer to the scholarship section of our homepage for more information. **REQUIRED COACHES TRAINING:** We offer voluntary coaches clinics, but MN law now mandates concussion training. To register to coach and to do a 30 minute free online concussion training session, see the coaches' link off our home page. Click "Concussion Proof of Certification" link and follow the instructions. All coaches, including assistants, will be required to register online and register proof of this concussion training online before coaching.

**CONCESSIONS:** RYBA will again have our concession stand opened Monday-Thursday for the entire house league season at the Rochester Baseball Complex. We will be offering hot dogs, nachos, popcorn, candy and soft drinks.

**Other Grade specific information (Refer to complete grade rules on the RYBA website):**

**Kindergarten T-Ball:** All players will hit the ball from the “T”.

**1<sup>st</sup> Grade 5-Pitch:** Each team will provide a pitcher (coach or parent) the entire season.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Player/Coach-Pitch:** Players/Coaches pitch; see www.rybamn.com click House and then Tournaments for more information. There is an optional (players must sign up) year end tournament for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade players at no additional cost.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Player Pitch:** Players/Coaches pitch (no walks) the first half of the season transitioning to only player pitch after the July 4th break. There is an optional (players must sign up) year end tournament for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade players at no additional cost.

**4-8<sup>th</sup> Grade Major/Minor Leagues:** Players are invited to try out for the major league in their grade level and area. Please check the box on your registration form if you want to try out for the “majors”. Those players that decide not to try out for majors or are not selected for a majors team will be assigned to a minor league team in their grade/area. There will be a year end weekend tournament for each grade and league.

**2012 RYBA Bat Rules:**

The National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) issued changes in 2011 for much of the high school levels due to the safety of many composite bats. Most National and Regional youth sports organizations deferred the change until 2012 including RYBA. Please refer to www.rybamn.com and select Rules under either HOUSE or TRAVELING tabs for information on bat rules for the 2012 season.

- March 1                **Grades 4-8:** Last date to guarantee placement on a team. Entries will be accepted after this date but only based on open roster spots.
- March 30              Last date to guarantee a tryout for 4<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade. MAJORS. Entries will be accepted after this date but will be assigned to minors based on open roster spots **or** to major tryout regions based on low numbers.
- April 1                **Grades K-3:** Last date to guarantee placement on a team. Entries will be accepted after this date but only based on open roster spots.

## 2012 Rochester Traveling Infomation

Again this year we will be using AAA, AA, and A designations rather than A, B, and C for our traveling baseball teams. The AAA designation is the highest level of competition followed by AA, and A. We will attempt to have two AAA teams and one AA team for each group, ages 10-14, depending on the number of players we have at tryouts.

Based on the success of the 10 & under program, again this year most players that attends tryouts for the 10 & U level will be able to participate in traveling baseball at one of the AAA, AA or A levels. This year, we again have a 10 & Under A (Travel only) team that will practice during the week and play in four tournaments throughout the summer. They will not participate in the House league. The remaining A teams will participate in the House league and will play in a minimized 4 week, 2 tournament A traveling program. This year we will look to have limited schedule A teams for the 11 year olds 12, 13, & 14 year olds. This will all be based on number of players trying out. These players will also participate on a House league team. For all A teams, if you qualify for a State Tournament your team can participate in one State Tournament.

**“House” League** – Non-traveling youth league within Rochester, all games played in Rochester.

**“Metro” League** – Traveling league for Rochester and SE metro cities, games played home and away age 12 & up.

**“Twilight” League** – 15 year old league of SE Minnesota teams, games played home and away.

**Tryouts:** Tryouts are free. There is no additional fee until the player is selected for a team. The tryouts will be held indoors at the UCR field house and RCTC dome. Each player will attend 3 sessions.

**Eligibility:** Players must meet one of the following criteria: attend an ISD #535 school or live within the ISD #535 boundary.

**Tournament Highlights:** The 12AAA and 14AAA teams will again be traveling to Omaha for the SlumpBuster Youth Tournament. This tournament takes place between June 15<sup>th</sup> and June 17<sup>th</sup> for 12AAA and between June 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> for 14AAA. This will be a great time for our ball players to compete with baseball teams from around the country as well as see a game at the College World Series.
