WHAT TO BRING/WHAT NOT TO BRING

SAMPLE PACKING LIST: Refer to sample daily schedule to decide your child's packing needs.

- Bedding for single size bunk bed: 1 twin sheet set and pillow/ a mattress cover can make bunk mattress more comfortable; Typical hot July temperatures opt for light blanket or just the sheet.
- 1 long sleeve T shirt for sun-protection– light color, breathable fabric is recommended
- 1 Good Raincoat or Poncho
- 1-2 Swimsuits - For boys: 'Speedo' swimsuits are not allowed
for girls: wear modest one piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt.
- 3 Bath Towels / 2 Wash Cloths
- 10 Pair Underwear
- 7 Shorts
- 10 T-Shirts
- Sleepwear
- 12 Pair Socks
- 1 Pair Basketball Shoes, 1 Pair Sports/Activity Shoes
- 1 Pair of Shower Shoes (flip flops)
- 1 Pair sweat pants
- 1 Laundry Bag / and 1 Trash Bag to separate any wet items in luggage, on the last day
- 1 Bible—AAO will provide a spiral and pen
- 1 Suitcase/Duffel/Gym Bag/or Foot Locker (Must not exceed 15 1/2" Height - under bunkbed)
- Toiletry Articles such as soap, toothbrush, shampoo, **SUNSCREEN**, chapstick, insect repellent...
- **MANDATORY: 2 Water bottles marked with camper's name.** Camp provides ice and water to refill water bottles. Everyone is required to carry water bottles to all activities. Hydration is key to fun!

OPTIONAL

- Camera
- Spending money for snacks, camp store

DO NOT BRING Cell phones, video cameras, alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon, radios, iPods, CD players, MP3's, pda's, laptops, play station portables or other electronic or gaming devices...

Anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, or other inappropriate topics
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes offensive behavior, racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- Spaghetti strap tops, excessively short shorts or skirts, tight fitting tops, etc.
- Cell phone reception is extremely limited and often non-existent. Cell phones brought to camp will be collected at check in and returned on the last day. AAO is not responsible for lost or stolen cell phones, so it is recommended to leave camper cell phones safe at home with parents.
- Please don't bring expensive jewelry, cameras, watches, sunglasses or other valuables you may lose or drop in the lake.
