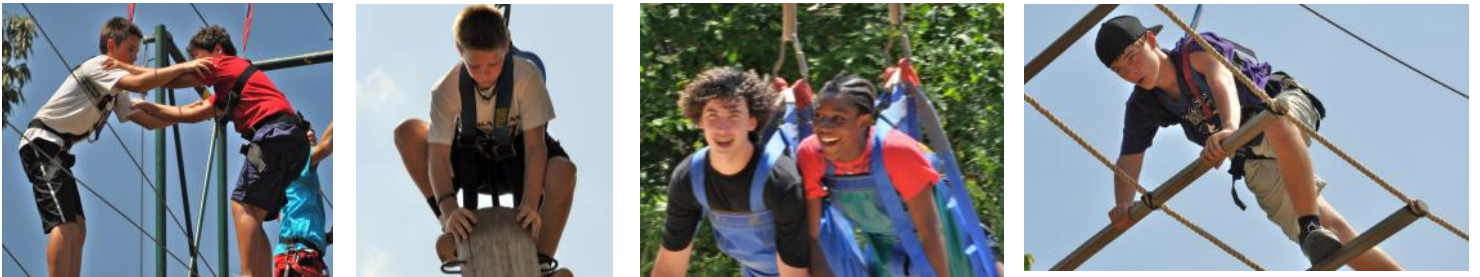

First-class Camping Facility

AAO is leading a group of 5-8th grade athletes invited from the NWA Basketball League to one of the safest, most respected, and professionally run camps in America. Kanakuk KAA Point 11 is a rental facility. That means that AAO brings the campers, coaches and a medical professional. There may be another youth group of boys and/or girls there during our camp term, but we will stay together and keep our own customized AAO schedule. Point 11 provides world-class facilities and a trained staff to run all non-basketball activities for our camp event, including certified lifeguards.

AAO Camp Coaches/Staff

AAO utilizes adult/parent volunteers who have coached in our league or who have experience in working with youth, plus some college students who have coached or worked among our program staff. We will have a 1-10 staff to camper ratio. Each camp coach will be processed through the National Sex Offender Public Registry.

AAO LIFE Camp Women's Director

We are delighted to introduce our women's camp director, Robin Stutts. Robin is the Area Director for Young Life ministries in Northwest Arkansas.

Camp Lodging and Dining

Campers lodge together by team/community -12 campers and 2 coaches. The cabins are non-air conditioned but have giant fans. Campers sleep in single bunk-beds. Bathhouses are detached from the cabins within a very short walking distance. Meals are served family style, by cabin, and the Dining Hall usually has a fresh salad bar available. Other snacks are available for purchase.

Insurance

Every participant must have their own health insurance. Health forms, including a photocopy of their personal medical insurance card is due to AAO by May 15.

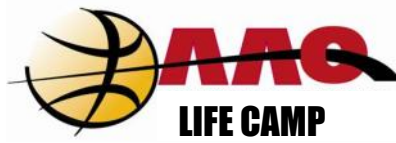
Fees and Registration

Normally an individual pays \$975 for a week at Kanakuk. Yet, because we bring our own coaches and programming, **your fee for AAO LIFE Camp is only \$350 per camper!** This is an incredible opportunity. However, here's the catch, spots are limited to the first 84 boys and 36 girls. Go to aaoteam.org and look for AAO LIFE Camp Registration. A \$150 deposit is required with registration to secure your spot. Kanakuk will reserve our cabins until February 29. After that they'll release them to other groups. If you know anything about Kanakuk they're typically full with waiting lists by spring.

Transportation to Camp

Each camper is responsible for providing their own transportation to camp. We plan to have a caravan depart from NWA at a designated time for any parents wanting to travel in a group.
