DAY CAMP

Boys and girls ages 6-10
June 18-21, 9:30-noon

Young players will learn soccer fundamentals, including technical skills and game rules. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing. Each camper will receive hands-on instruction from college coaches, based on the player's level of skill and tactical development. Each camper will receive giveaway items. If camp is cancelled twice due to rain, makeup day will be Friday, June 22.

ELITE CAMP

Boys and girls ages 10-14
June 18-21, 1-4 p.m.

Youth players will learn high-level technical abilities and basic tactical strategies. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing, as well as creating space, combination plays, transition play, and styles of play. Each camper will receive intensive instruction from coaches, based on skill and tactical development, as well as video analysis of technical abilities. Goalkeeper training will be available. Each camper will receive giveaway items. If camp is cancelled twice due to rain, makeup day will be Friday, June 22.

GK ACADEMY

Boys and girls ages 12-18
June 20-Aug. 2, Wed. or Thurs. nights

Campers will be assigned into small groups for 1.5 hours on Wednesday or Thursday nights. They will be trained by the Wartburg goalkeeping coach and staff on goalkeeping techniques. For more information, please contact Coach Pins.

2-DAY PREMIER CAMP

Young women ages 14-18
July 8-10

Premier players will prepare for high-level high school soccer and the college game by learning through small-sided games, a technical session, and a full-sided game. Goalkeeper training will be available throughout the day. Sessions will cover the mental and physical aspects of the game to teach players the motivational skills required for high-level competition. Each camper will receive a T-shirt.

FACILITIES

Campers will utilize some of the best outdoor facilities in the Iowa Conference. Camp drills and game action will be held at Knights Soccer Complex and Walston-Hoover Stadium.

PARENTS: Each registered camper will receive a confirmation letter, including map and directions, rules and regulations, and check-in information. On the final day of each session, parents are invited to observe their sons and daughters during the instruction period. CAMP DIRECTOR

Tiffany Pins, Women's Head Coach

Pins, a 2005 Wartburg graduate, was named head women's soccer coach in January 2011.

In Pins' first season at the helm, the Knights finished 17-2-3, claimed a share of the Iowa Conference regular-season crown, qualified for the conference tournament, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Nine players were named All-Conference, including Katy Wendt, who was the Conference MVP. Wendt was also named an NSCAA All-American, NSCAA Scholar All-American, Capital One Academic All-American, and Capital One Academic All-District. Additionally, three players were named All-Region for the first time in program history. This squad set the single-season record with 12 shutout victories.



As a player, Pins was a three-time Wartburg MVP and 2004 all-Iowa Conference honoree. She starred on squads that won 10 or more matches twice, including a 16-3-1 mark during her senior season. As an assistant, she helped lead two teams to 10 or more victories, including a 14-6 mark in 2005. As an assistant coach at Denison University from 2007 to 2010, Pins was part of a program that achieved three NCAA Division III tournament berths, reached the Elite Eight in 2010, and won two regular-season titles and one North Coast Athletic Conference tournament title.

Pins earned a Master of Arts degree in physical education with an emphasis in teaching and coaching from the University of Northern Iowa. She also has an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

TRANSPORTATION

If you fly, transportation to campus will be provided from the Waterloo Municipal Airport, located 15 miles south of Waverly. It is important to notify our office at least two weeks prior to camp of your flight number and arrival time. Parking will be provided for campers who drive to Waverly, but they will not be permitted to use their vehicles at any time during the camp.
