

## **Scott Raduka**

### **WISTCA Merit Award**

In his 27th year at Oconomowoc High School, Scott spent the first 8 in the classroom, another 9 as the Associate Principal and now 10 as the Associate Principal/Athletic Director. He also had 6 years as an assistant football coach, 3 years with boys basketball, 1 in girls basketball and 21 years coaching track & field. As the Athletic Director, Scott has supervised and helped fundraise approximately 7.3 million dollars of Athletic Facility up-grades in the past 8 years.

During Scott's 9 years as a Head Track & Field Coach at Oconomowoc, his teams won 2 conference championships, 18 individuals qualified for the WIAA Division I State Meet, and 2 won individual event titles. He also trained Mel Mueller in the pole vault for 2 years. Mel was a 2000 Olympian. In 1995, Scott received the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Distinguished Service Award, and was also selected by his peers as the 1991 WISTCA District VI Coach of the Year.

On WISTCA's behalf, Scott was very instrumental in the development and growth of our annual clinic. He served as the District VI Representative from 1990-93, and was the Founder and first President of the Wisconsin Pole Vault Coaches Association where he chaired the PVCA at our clinic in 1993-1996 and in 1998. Scott spoke as a clinician at the annual WISTCA Clinic in 1990, 1995, 1996 and 2000. Before other job responsibilities took him away, Scott finished his years serving WISTCA as the Assistant Clinic Director from 2001-2005. His dedication to all sports is greatly appreciated, but his expertise in the sport of track and field has been a true benefit to high school athletes, coaches and parents in the State of Wisconsin.
