**PYA HALL OF FAME**

**STAN PLOMINSKI**



Stan Plominski has lived in Port Washington nearly his whole life and grew up in the early days of the PYA program in the mid-1960's. He is one of the best athletes those early days produced, and is recognized tonight not only for those exploits, but his volunteer dedication to the organization as an adult.

Stan played PYA tackle football (travel in those days), basketball, and baseball for 5 years each as a youth. He continued with football and basketball as he moved on to Sousa Junior High School and Paul D. Schreiber High School. He also participated on the track teams in both schools. In college, at the University of New Hampshire, Stan also played football and ran track - the highlight of the latter was having competed in several Decathlons during that time.

After graduating from UNH he returned to Port Washington as he and his wife Patti started their family. His 3 children all played in numerous PYA sports. Stan became tremendously active in our organization all during their involvement, as a head coach for football for 10 years, and as a head basketball coach for 10 years. He was also a basketball commissioner for 8 years. For many years he coordinated the referees for the basketball programs. Since he had nothing to do in the springtime, Stan also became a head lacrosse coach for the PYA boys PAL travel team for 10 years as well, though he never played the game.

In 1993, Stan joined the Board of PYA, and was active for 15 years. In 2008, he "retired" from that service and was elected to the Alumni Board of Directors. In between, he was a key part of the Field, Dinner Dance, Sportsmanship/Disciplinary, and Snack Bar Committees. He ran the latter for 4 years. He also prides himself as the former Head of the Wooden Bleacher Repair Committee, and a Field Committee "Master Electrician" during PYA's renaissance. In fact, Stan is still changing light bulbs in and around Lions Field.

Stan is also proud that he was one of the dedicated PYA supporters who participated in multiple 110-mile bicycle ride fund-raisers from Port Washington to Montauk Point to help pay for the renovation of Lions Field.

Stan has found success in his long career in the technology industry. Stan and Patti have 3 grown children, Kevin, Laura, and Matthew.
