



San Mateo Little League American Privacy Policy

San Mateo Little League American is committed to protecting the privacy and security of visitors to our website. Outlined below is our online privacy policy for information collected through this website and email lists. Resale or disclosure of information to third parties:

We do not share or otherwise disclose any personal information, including your name, address and email address with organizations outside San Mateo National Little League. Only staff and coaches have access to personally identifying information provided by visitors to our site. We do not exchange, trade, rent, or give e-mail lists to third parties, and will send you e-mails only related to the Little League's activities.

Browser information collected on our website:

As with most website operators, San Mateo Little League American continuously analyzes our website logs to improve the value of our website. We use a service to provide real-time reporting to us of browser accesses to our site, including page views, unique views, unique visitors, repeat visitors, frequency of visits, and peak-volume traffic periods. We do not use this service to gather, request, record, require, collect or track any Internet users' personally identifying information.

Privacy of our email lists:

San Mateo Little League American maintains our e-mail list to keep those who choose to receive updates on the Little League's issues and activities only. Individuals must request to join our mailing lists. In addition, we do not share the email addresses on our lists with any outside organizations. Only staff and coaches of the Little League have access to personally identifying information provided by visitors to our site.

Children's privacy:

Because we care about the safety and privacy of children online, we comply with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act of 1998 (COPPA). COPPA and its accompanying FTC regulation establish United States federal law that protects the privacy of children using the Internet. We do not knowingly collect contact or personal information from children under 13. Our site is not intended to solicit information of any kind from children under 13, and we have designed our site to block our knowing acceptance of information from children under 13 whenever age related information is requested.

It is possible that by fraud or deception by others we may receive information given to us by children under 13. If we are notified of this, as soon as we verify the information, we will immediately obtain parental consent or otherwise delete the information from our servers. Security:

We have implemented appropriate security measures in the design and use of our website and in our physical facilities to protect against the loss or misuse of information that we have collected from you at our site.
